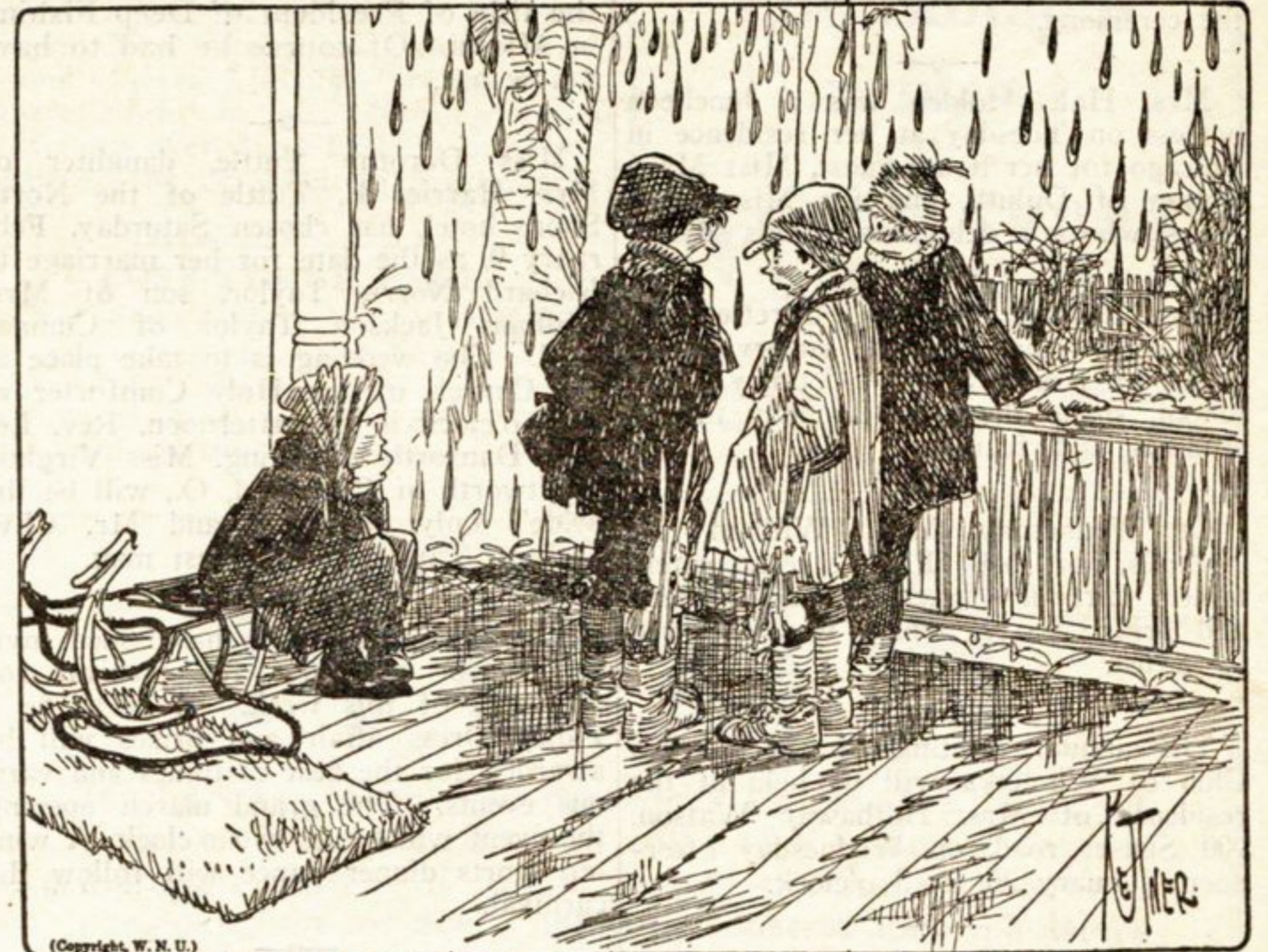

RATHBONE SEEKS RE-NOMINATION

Congressman at Large States His Reasons

In a letter directed to the editor of Wilmette Life this week, Henry Riggs Rathbone, congressman at large for Illinois, announces his candidacy for re-nomination at the primaries next fall.

"I deeply appreciate the high honor that has been conferred upon me by the people of Illinois and the confidence they have placed in me. I feel that my work has only just begun, as the first session of Congress during my term of office commenced on December 23, 1923.
