Winnetka Branch of Society Makes Annual Appeal for Funds

SERVICE IS DESCRIBED

"Be Generous and Help" Reads the Plea

The annual drive for funds of the Winnetka branch of the Infant Welfare society has begun. Officers of the branch are telling of the society's good work and of the crying need for financial aid. Mrs. Morris Wilson, president of the local branch, and Mrs. Edmund Bartlett, secretary, this week issued the following communication, giving a brief account of the activities of the organization and embodying an appeal for contributions from residents of the community.

"If you are interested in saving lives of babies in Chicago give to the Winnetka branch of the Infant Welfare society. Through it Winnetka helps right in a quarter of the city where the baby death rate is very high. All the money raised by it in Winnetka goes to the work of the Infant Welfare station at the Chicago Commons settlement. Most of it is spent to maintain three nurses who spend all their time making calls and helping mothers prepare food for the little ones.

Service That Counts

"It's the doctor at the conference who tells mother what baby needs to eat. But mother finds it hard to follow instructions. Everything is so different in Chicago from what it is in Italy: the weather, the grocery, the stove. Besides she isn't used to bothering about measuring and cooking and the care of milk. But baby gets thinner and thinner, and other Conference babies look so rosy. And then, one day, mother wakes up, and does exactly what nurse has been showing her so long how to do. And then when she goes to the Infant Welfare conference baby shows a decided gain!

Cuts Death Rate

"The death rate of Chicago babies under two is about 54 to a 1,000, of infant welfare babies about 14 to a 1,000. The Infant Welfare society helps to make Chicago a healthier city. The annual drive of the Winnetka branch for funds has begun. Every little contribution helps. Do be generous and help!
