Lenten Organ Recital At St. Luke's Church

The seventh of the North Shore series of organ recitals on the great organ of St. Luke's church, Evanston, is announced for Tuesday evening, April 15, at 8 o'clock. It will be a Lenten program given by Herbert E. Hyde, member of the American Guild of Organists and superintendent of the Chicago Civic Music Association; assisted by Walter L. Kraeckmann, basso. The program includes two of Mr. Hyde's own compositions "Spring" and "Lullaby" the latter in manuscript; his transcription for the organ of Simonetti's violin melody "Mardrigale;" several other spring songs; Thiele's brilliant technical piece "Chromatic Fantasy;" Foot's "Pater Noster" (in which the echo organ is used); and the "Funeral March on the Death of a Hero" from Beethoven's "Eroique Symphony."

Mr. Hyde is one of the leading organists of the country, and as the great organ of St. Luke's church was built to his specifications, peculiar interest attaches to his interpretations upon it.
