Mrs. Thomas Coyne, 240 Melrose avenue, entertained her sewing circle at an informal luncheon on Tuesday.

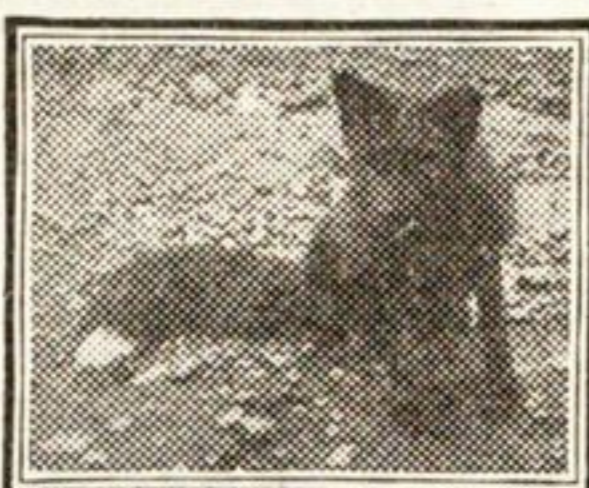

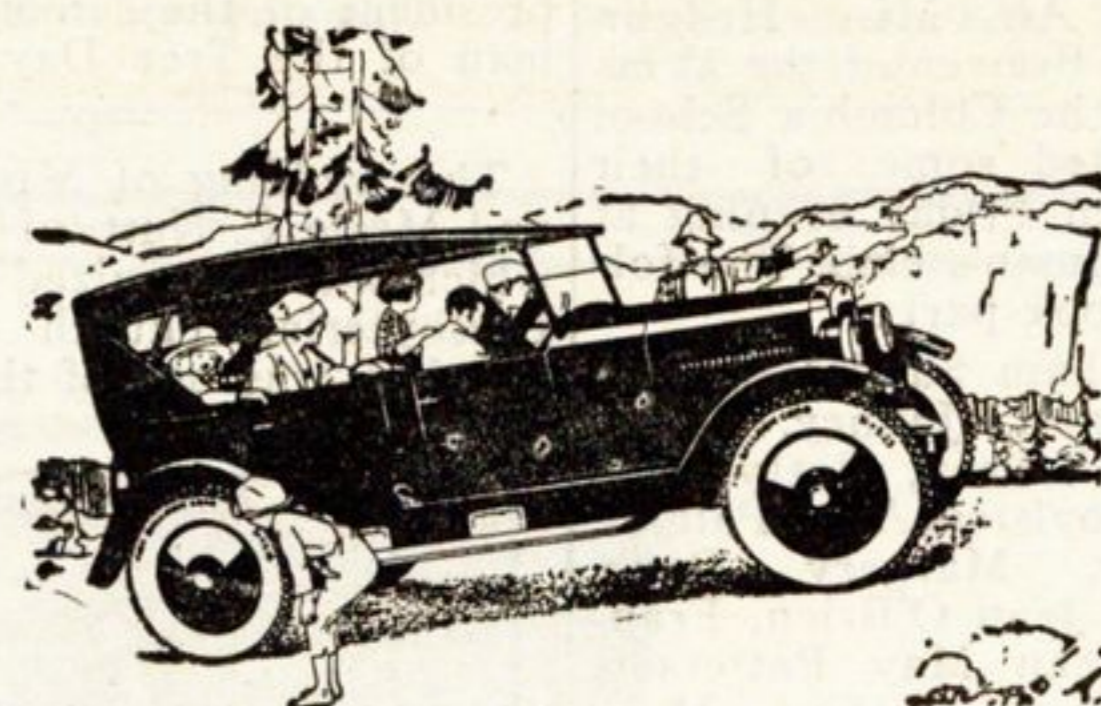

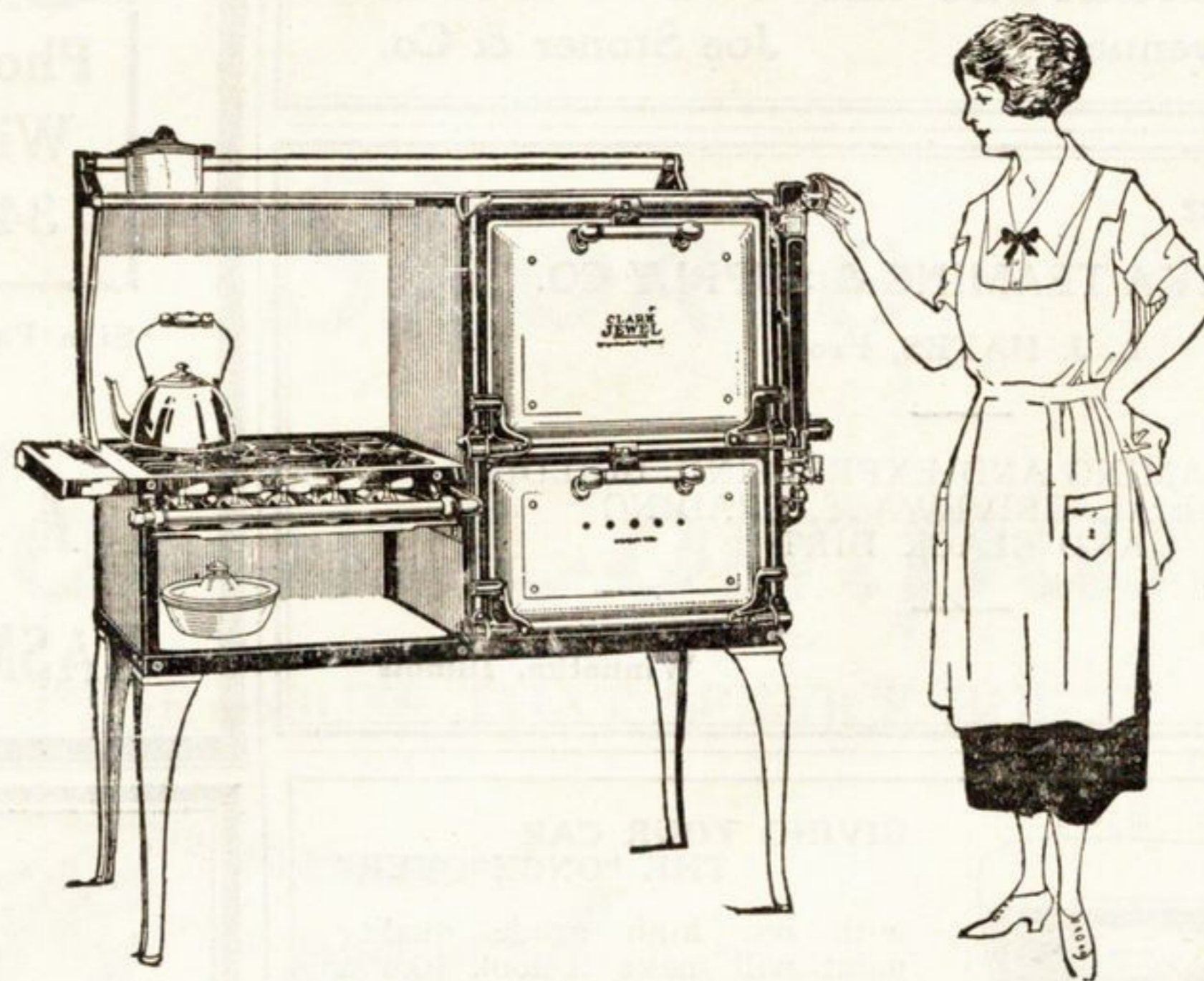
