

### COUNTRY DAY PUPILS CELEBRATE MAYTIME

At 10 o'clock last Tuesday morning the North Shore Country Day school turned out to celebrate the May season in song, dance and procession. Two buglers, arrayed in heraldic costumes, called from all the buildings hosts of farmers, milk-maids, pirates, Robinhoods, and other gay merry-makers, who wound around the campus in a colorful line, singing "Summer is icumen in," "Come, lads and lassies," and other traditional May melodies. To a bower of flowers then came the May Queen, Mary Ott, and her flower girls and maidens. The queen rode in a flower-decked pony cart, her maidens carrying long ropes of flowers before her.

After the crowning, the artists and poets came forward and with their paintings and verses to Spring, and Robinhood's band held an archery contest and gave a little play on the green, written by the fifth grade in their study of the Robinhood ballads. This was followed by many a famous old English dance and game, such as "Here come some Dukes a-riding," "King of the Barbarees," Sellenger's Round" (an old May-pole dance dating from about 1450), "Bean Setting," and others.

The high school boys in white gave a quarterstaff drill, the seventh and eighth grade girls danced the May-pole, an elaborate and pretty figure with the colored streamers from the pole; and at the end the guests, faculty, and children all joined in a general round to complete the yearly festival.


