Mrs. Thomas Ratcliffe, 804 Lincoln avenue, left a week ago for Europe, to be gone until the first of September.

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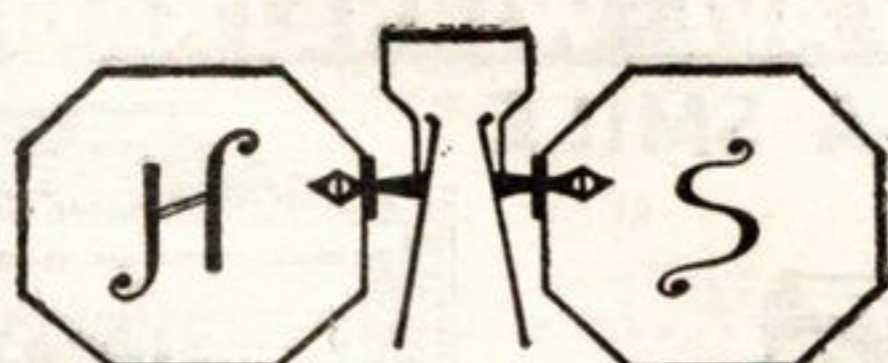
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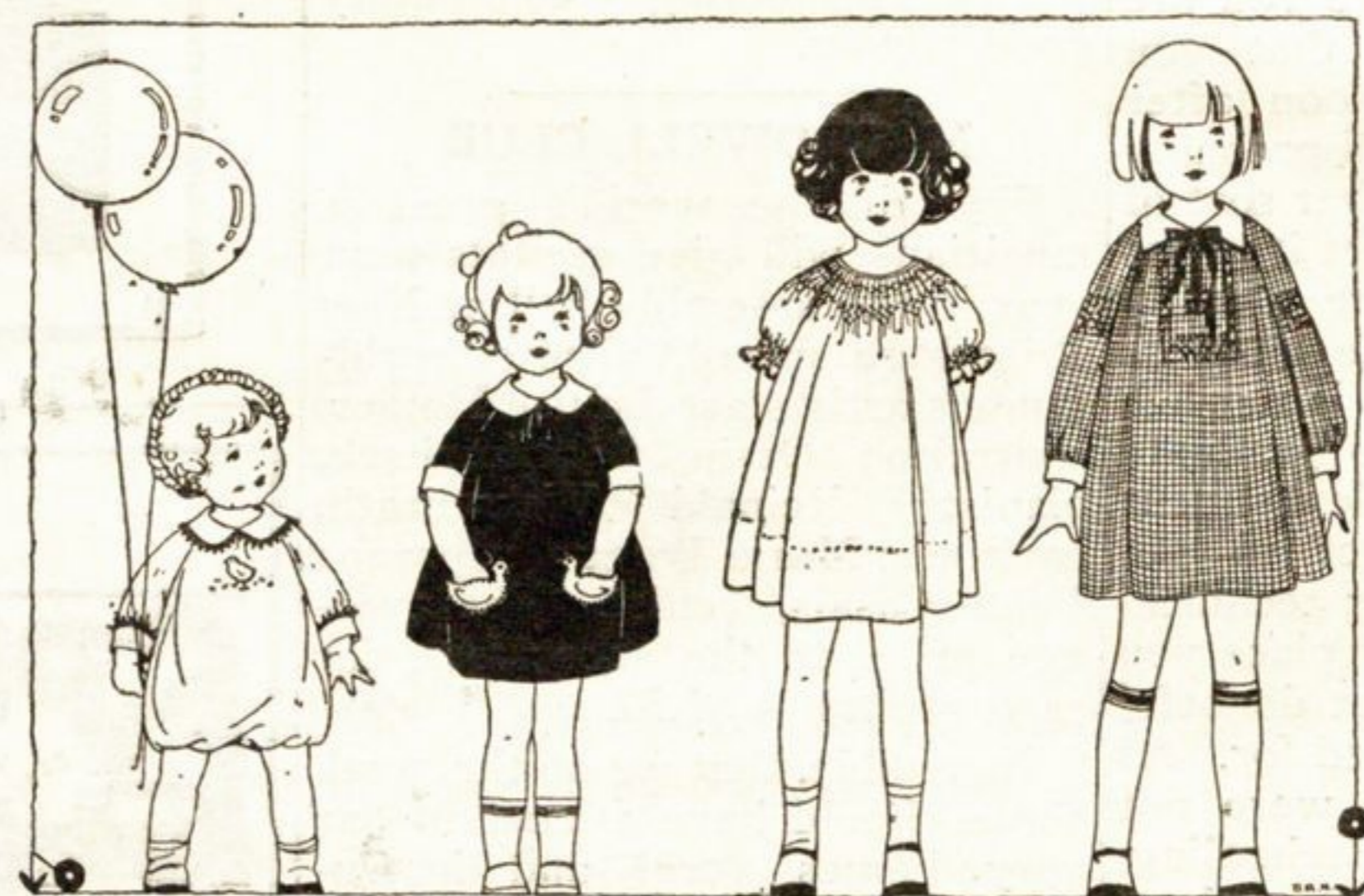
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
