

# ARDEN SHORE CAMP OPENS

## Fairy Godfather, Mother Good to "Guests"

The summer season at Arden Shore camp opened Friday morning, June 27, when the first group of 500 mothers and children came out from their crowded homes to enjoy the rest and the good times that await them at open air camp—the only free camp near Chicago.

Numbered in this first group are 30 little convalescent boys, from Chicago hospitals, who will occupy the Willets cottage, and across the green will be found 30 small, pale convalescent girls, all of whom will have a chance to grow strong and rosy before the summer is over. In the beautiful Hamill cottage one may see 30 undernourished girls from the Vocational bureau. All of these children will receive the same expert care and the special diet that works such wonders with the boys in the winter.

### Have Fairy Godmother

The 25 little Cinderellas, most of them motherless and themselves "little mothers," will find that a regular godmother has given them a beautiful new cottage under the big trees, right on the bluff overlooking the lake. The fairy godmother is Mrs. Arthur F. Tuttle, of Winnetka, and the cottage was built in memory of her mother, Mrs. James Houghteling.

Perhaps nobody ever heard of a fairy godfather, but these little girls have one and he has sent out a whole troop of dolls so that each little girl who is there during the summer may have a doll to love and to take home with her when she goes.

Many of the mothers have surprises in store for them also when they find themselves and their families quartered in charming screened cottages instead of the old tents. Across the playground from Cinderella lodge are three of these cottages, one of them the gift of J. J. Charles, of Evanston, one given by Mrs. George A. Mason, of Highland Park, and one built in memory of L. J. Lamson.

### Live in Cottages

All the mothers with tiny babies will live in cottages this year as the Motherville group has been augmented by three little houses. One of these is called Wilmette Cottage and was given by friends of the camp, in Wilmette; another comes from a dinner club of ten members, also in Wilmette, and the third is the gift of the Service club of Chicago.

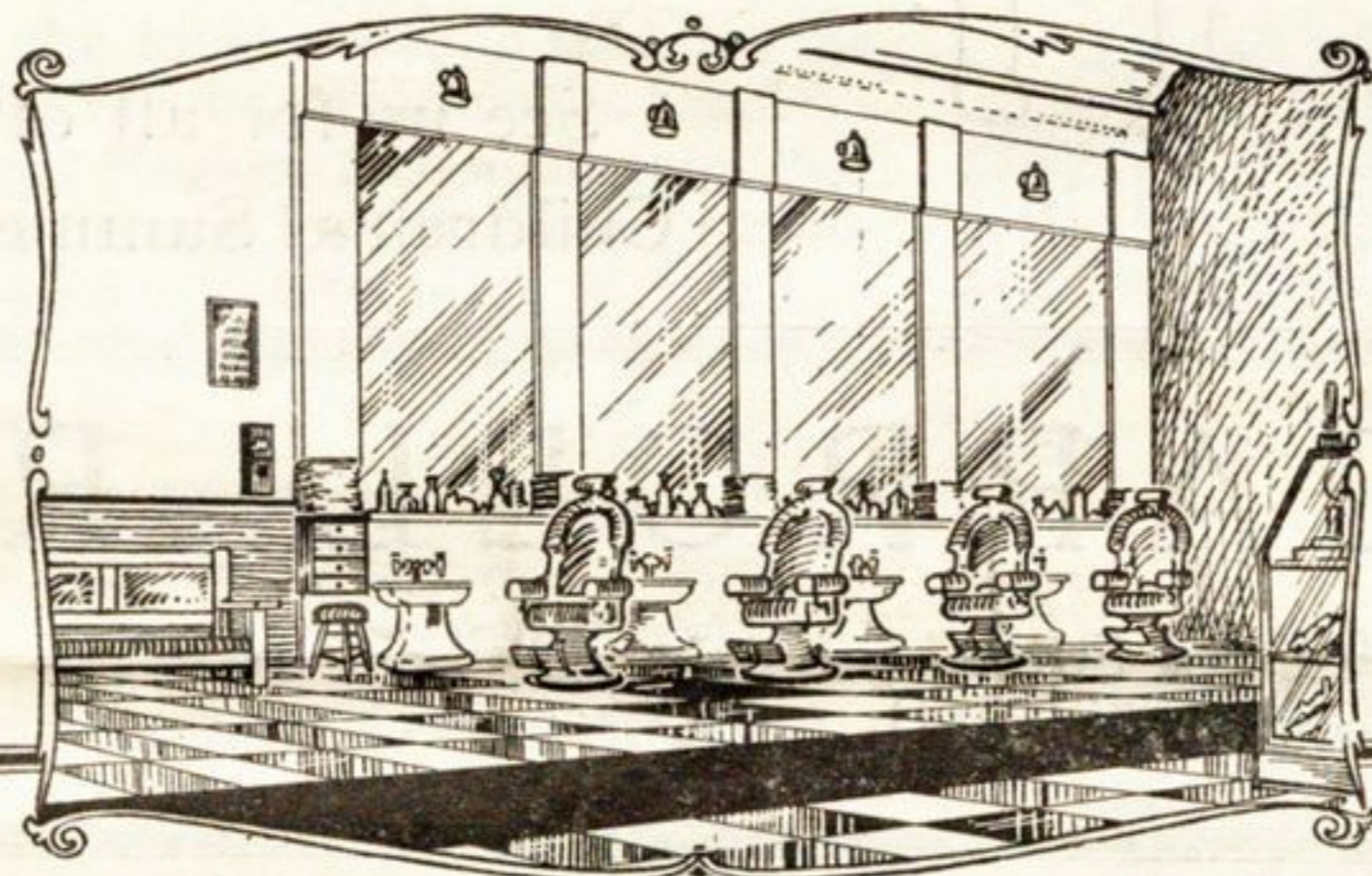

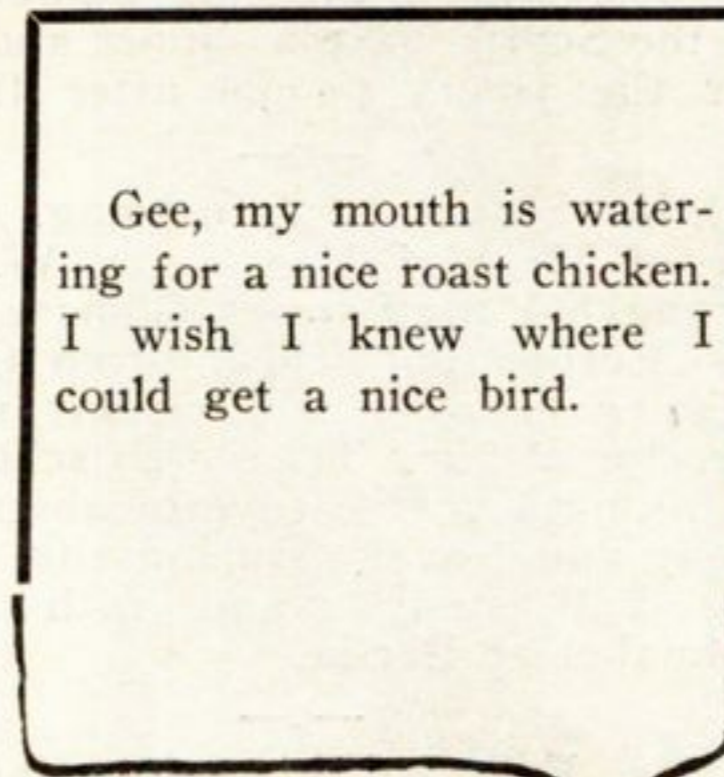
