

TAKE WINNETKA SCHOOL PLAN TO OTHER TOWNS

Two of Winnetka's public school teachers have been granted leave of absence this year to introduce the Winnetka methods of teaching in other school systems. Miss Marion Carswell, principal of the Hubbard Woods school, will be at Bronxville, New York, where a complete system of individual instruction, patterned after that used in Winnetka, is to be introduced. Miss Carswell will have charge of the reorganizing of the schools on this basis.

Miss Florence Fake, a primary teacher from the Hubbard Woods school has gone to Geneva, Switzerland, at the request of the "International School," a small school for children of people connected with the League of Nations. A sister of Mrs. Raymond Durham of Winnetka is one of the patronesses of this school. The school advertises that it will include the methods successfully incorporated in the schools of Winnetka, U. S. A. It was in order to enable this school to put in the Winnetka plan that Miss Fake was given a year's leave of absence by the Winnetka Board of Education.

Winnetka Claims Place in Newest "Who's Who"

The names of thirty-six residents of Winnetka appear in Who's Who in America, 1924-25. Of these thirty-six "notable living men and women" in Winnetka two are women and these two women are Mrs. Frank A. Helmer, editor of the Chicago Legal News, and Dr. Lillian Taylor, specialist in ear, nose, and throat surgery.

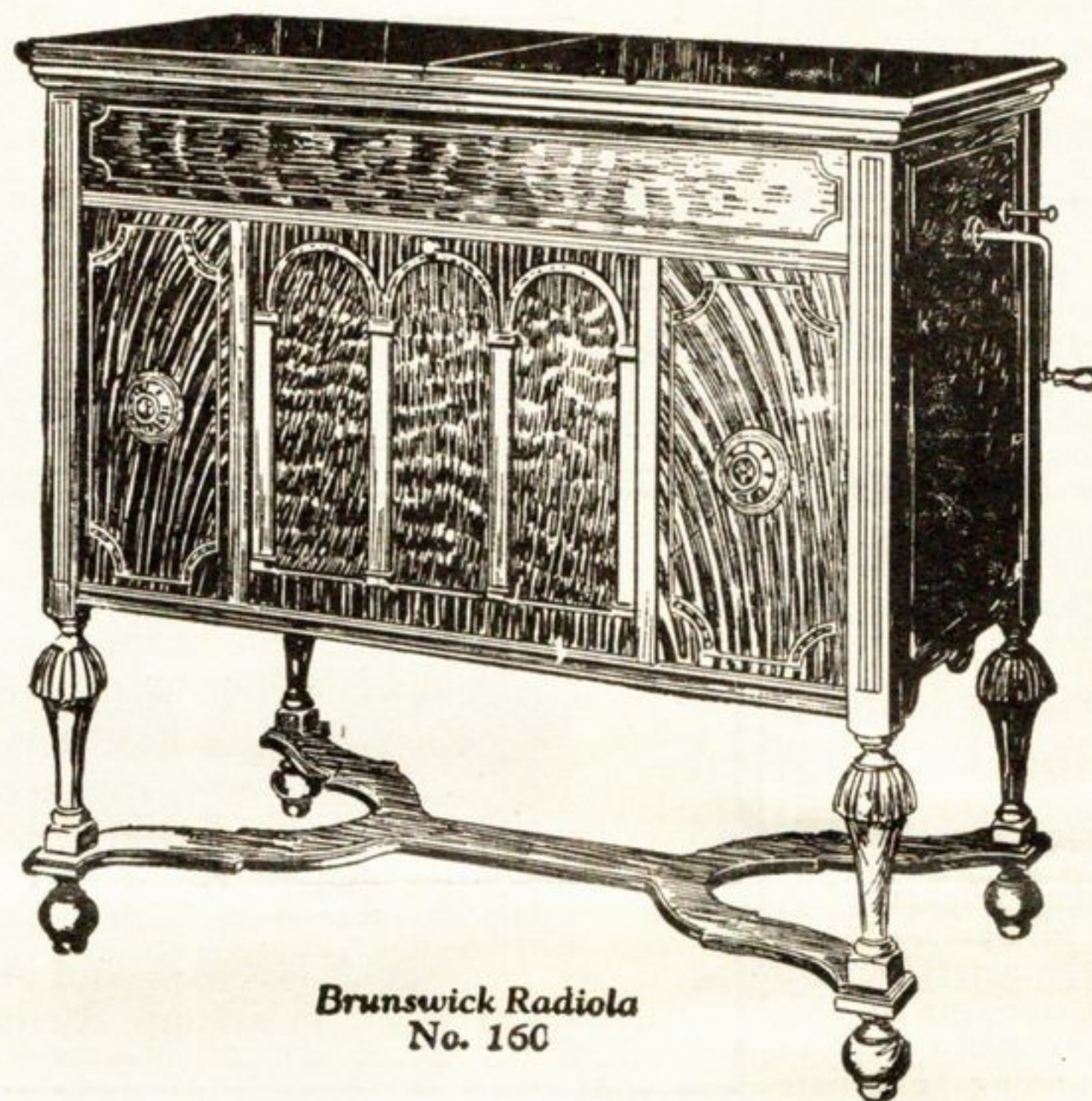
