

WED OPERA AND CHURCH SUNDAY

North Shore Pastor Places Opera on Program

Grand Opera and the Church will be formally united in marriage next Sunday evening at the Rogers Park Baptist church, Greenleaf and Hildale avenue, the Rev. Herschel R. Griffin, pastor, officiating.

Grand Opera selections will be sung by a member of the congregation, Miss Helen Freund, a young American who will make her debut this season with Chicago Civic Opera. There will be "community singing" and the Rev. Griffin will talk a few minutes on "The Heart of Melody."

The church will be packed—this young clergyman, who served as a chaplain in the army always has a packed church at his Sunday evening concert-devotionals. The Rev. Griffin will only talk a few minutes.

"When my congregation is full of the inspiration of good music, I don't talk it all out of them."

And why this wedding of Grand Opera and the Church, this union that the pastor will celebrate not one but every Sunday evening? Simple—because good music is harmony, religion is harmony and things equal to the same thing are equal to each other.

The background of fact leading up to this new concept that grand opera and devotions have much in common, much that should be emphasized, is a satisfying tale. It goes back seven years to the first few weeks of war time, to a time when the Rev. Griffin, not then ordained, decided that his convictions were with the service and off he went to the recruiting office. Soon he had a commission as a chaplain. He was on the west coast, in Los Angeles, and the nights were crowded with temptations for young men just getting their first feel of khaki. Chaplain Griffin wished to keep his boys somewhere in line, he wished to build morals and he thought music potent.

So he went to see Mme. Nellie Melba that grand old campaigner in opera then in Southern California. He told her of his problem, what he hoped to accomplish. He saw great assemblies of soldiers listening attentively to great artists in evening concerts, craving good music instead of a carouse at some Barbary coast.

From the depths of a full life and her rich experience, Melba remarked, "Do you know the answer to all religious interpretation is music?" Griffin did not—then—but he had vaguely sensed some such idea. Anyway, it grew and unfolded in his consciousness.

He began to develop it when he went overseas, which was soon afterwards, and when he worked with the army in France. He began to think, "To live in Hell is to be a moral failure. One of the first steps a moral failure takes is to lose a desire for the finer things of life, for the beauty of the arts, for the inspiration and ennobling qualities of music."

Chevrolet Has Cheapest Coach on Auto Market

The Chevrolet Motor company announces a new model to its line—the Chevrolet coach, which will be the lowest priced coach on the market.

This Chevrolet coach, however, differs from most of the coaches on the market in that the rear panels are steel clear to the top, like the other Chevrolet closed models, and is finished in black with gold stripe—the same as the Chevrolet sedan.

The door on each side is exceptionally large allowing for easy entrance and exit, while the wide windows, two on each side, afford an extreme range of vision during all seasons and refreshing ventilation in warm weather. The rear quarter windows are the same width as the door windows.

The interior of the coach is large and roomy, with the driver's seat stationary and a folding seat to the right of the driver. The rear seat across the back has ample room for three.

The seats and cushions are upholstered in striped taupe wool cloth, while the sides, doors and head-lining are in mottled taupe of the same material. There is a floor carpet to match.

Door windows, as well as side windows are raised and lowered by Ternerstedt window regulators. There is a dome light in the car. The rear window in the car is wide and deep and is equipped with a satin curtain. A metal sun visor comes as standard equipment.

Add Facilities to Aid Supply of Gas Service

At the Public Service company gas station at Niles, west of Evanston, a new condenser and a new shaving scrubber are in operation, contributing their part to the plans of providing for the increased demands on the plant. These additional machines will materially help the operating problems created by the demand, it is explained.

Niles station, one of the most important gas manufacturing plants in the company's system, supplies a large territory extending to Evanston and Wilmette and to the towns north of Park Ridge to Wauconda. Here are many towns, practically all of them growing rapidly as more and more people go from Chicago to suburban homes. Gas starts from Niles, through the main to Park Ridge and north under 35-pound pressure, the necessary reduction being made by friction in the line and by withdrawals of the fluid as it goes into use. Pressure in the Evanston line being much shorter is, of course, much below that in the northwestern line.
