

DEDICATE GIFT PIANO MONDAY

Residents Invited to Gradova Recital

On Monday evening, October 13, in Jane Kuppenheimer Memorial hall, the new Steinway concert grand piano, presented to Skokie school by Mr. and Mrs. Louis B. Kuppenheimer, will be dedicated in a recital to be given by Miss Gitta Gradova.

Miss Gradova is ranked as a pianist of most unusual technical ability and extraordinary interpretative powers, regarded by The Nation as the "foremost woman pianist now before the public."

Musical critics have testified to the pianistic talent of Miss Gradova. "She has," writes the New York World, "an exceptionally powerful and sensitively colored tone; a fine sense of rhythm, and a mind of her own in regard to interpretations." The New York Times says of her: "Her technic is strong and supple, full of grace, and allows free play to an analytical mind and a poetic personality."

Legion Makes Plans for Annual Election, Dinner

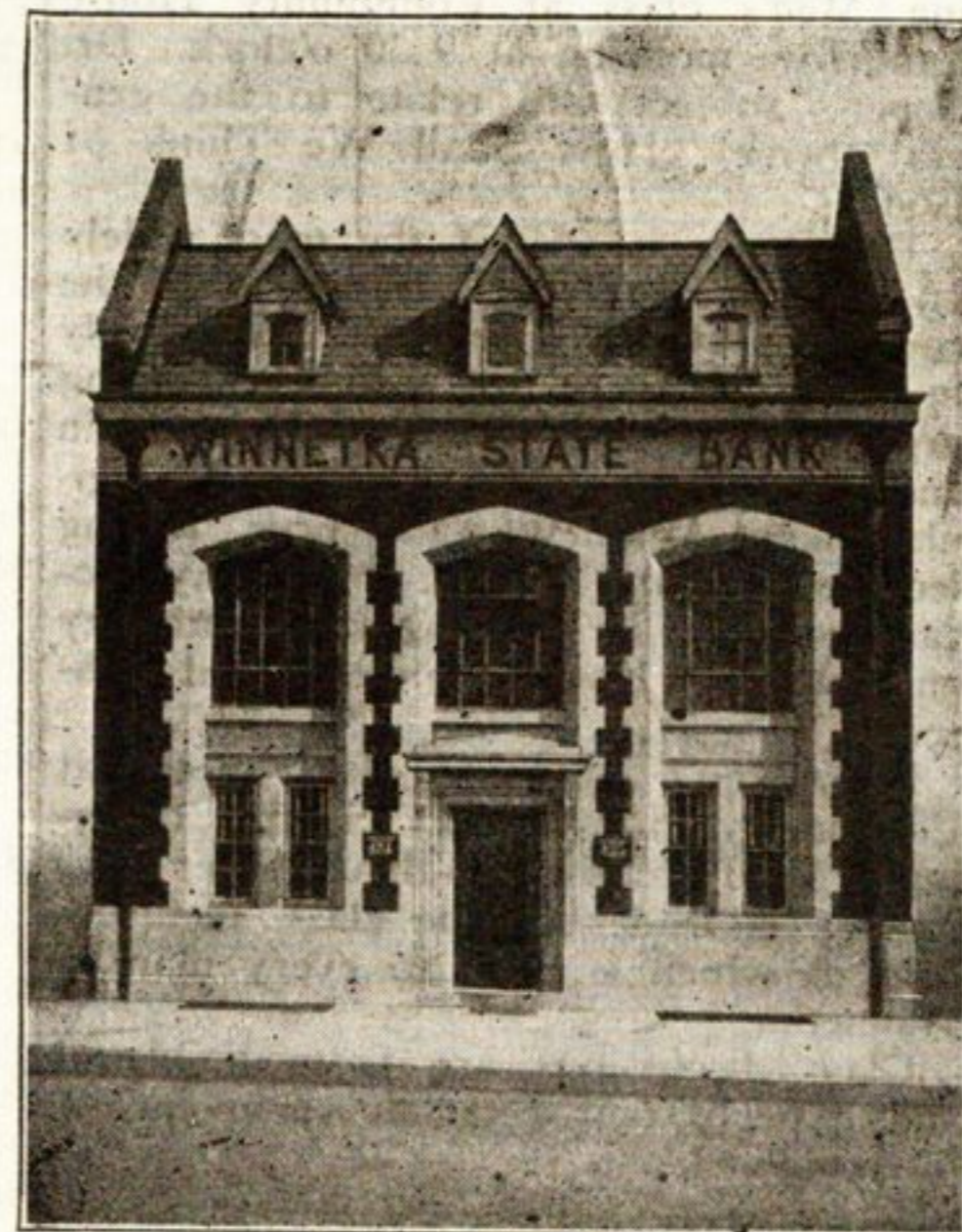
At a special meeting of Winnetka Post No. 10, American Legion, held at the Community House, Thursday of this week, a nominating committee was
