

WINNETKA STARS IN GUILD PLAY

Mrs. E. B. L. Brown Appears in Leading Role

The complete cast was announced this week for the North Shore Theatre Guild's opening production of "The Enchanted Cottage." A large number of Winnetka people are in the cast.

In addition to Guy Stewart Bailey, who is making his reappearance in the leading part, Mrs. E. B. L. Brown and J. Williams Macy of Winnetka are making their reappearance with the Guild in this production. Mrs. Brown has appeared previously in "Twelve Hundred a Year," "Dear Brutus" and "March Hares." Mr. Macy has played in "Come Seven," "Pygmalion," "Dear Brutus," "Twelve Hundred a Year" and "Mary the Third."

Mrs. Brown is playing the part of Mrs. Smallwood, and opposite her is Percy B. Eckhart, who is making his first reappearance after a year's absence from the casts, as Mr. Smallwood. Both parts are filled with great high comedy possibilities. Their parts are rich with humorous lines and amusing situations. Mr. Macy is playing Hillary, a blind man, which calls for great emotional acting and yet a lively sense of humor. It is the strongest part that Mr. Macy has ever played. Mrs. Alexander O. Mason of Highland Park, Mr. Thomas Rollo and Miss Margaret Fabian of Evanston complete the cast. Miss Eleanor Eckhart of Kenilworth, as announced last week, is playing the leading girl's part.

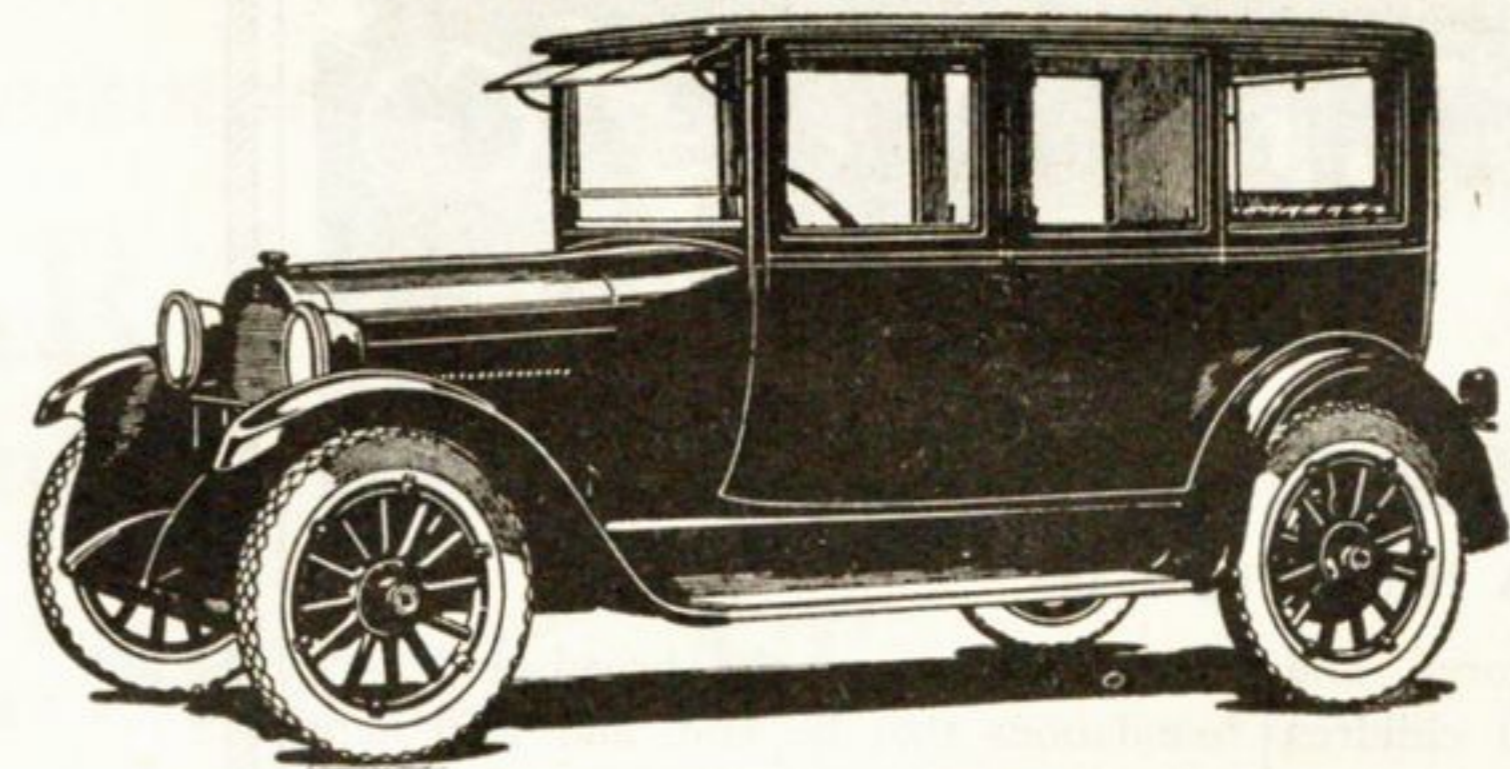

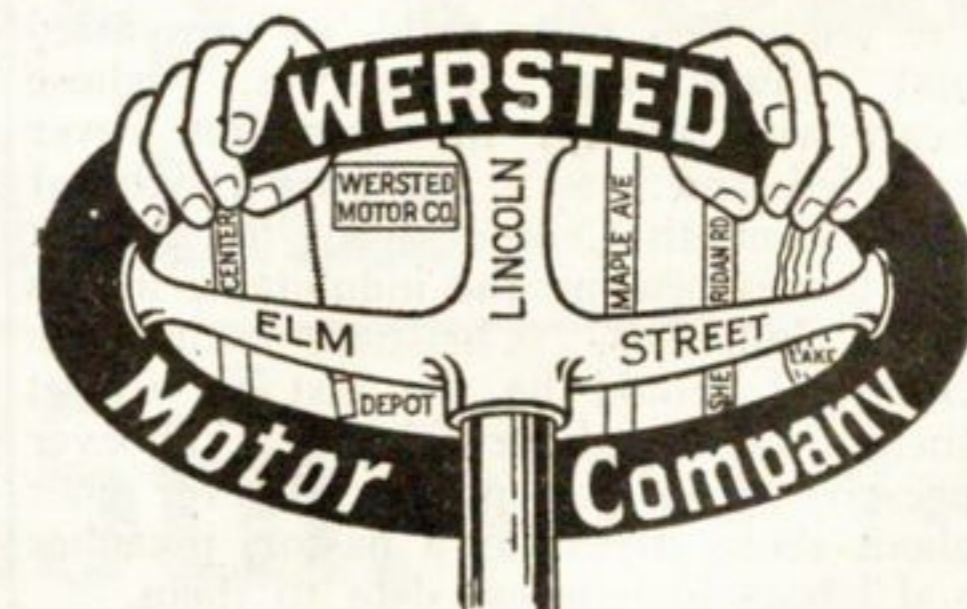
