

**DR. E. B. SOPER AGAIN  
ADDRESSES MEN'S CLASS**

Dr. Edmund B. Soper, professor of the History of Religion at Northwestern university, has been secured for a return lecture before the Winnetka Sunday Morning Men's class tomorrow morning at 9:30 o'clock in Community House.

In a lecture, a few weeks ago, entitled, "How Shall We Think of God?", Dr. Soper made a distinct impression upon his audience and it was the unanimous request of the class members that every effort be put forth to have the noted authority give another lecture in the near future.

This Sunday, Dr. Soper will discuss the subject, "How Shall We Think of Christ?"

Dr. Soper has traveled extensively in foreign lands, experiencing prolonged sojourns in Japan and India, and his utterances are based upon a thorough and practical knowledge of his subject. He is constantly in demand for lectures and the Men's class is especially favored in having him return for another discussion of the current class theme.

Every man in Winnetka is invited to attend Sunday's discussion and to enter into the membership of the class. The sessions are non-sectarian and subjects are considered from a liberal and practical point of view with the purpose in mind of studying Bible teachings in the light of modern economic and social standards.

**Local Banks Show Steady Growth in Their Deposits**

Winnetka's two banking houses have combined aggregate deposits well in excess of \$2,250,000, according to the official reports of condition of the banks published in last week's issue of WINNETKA TALK.

The Winnetka Trust and Savings Bank approaches \$1,200,000 in total deposits, while the Winnetka State Bank shows total deposits of \$1,091,109.36.

Total resources of the Winnetka

State Bank are given as \$1,203,760.15 and total deposits of \$1,091,109.36.

At the Winnetka Trust and Savings Bank the total resources show \$1,239,453.66 and the total deposits are \$1,181,273.22.

Winnetka State Bank deposits show an increase of \$224,433.24 since the report of January 1924; while those of the Winnetka Trust and Savings Bank show an increase of \$198,385.29 over the January 1924 report.

The indicated wholesome growth of the banking houses bespeaks the interest and utmost confidence of the community in its own financial insti-

tutions, declared a local business man in commenting on the recent bank statements.

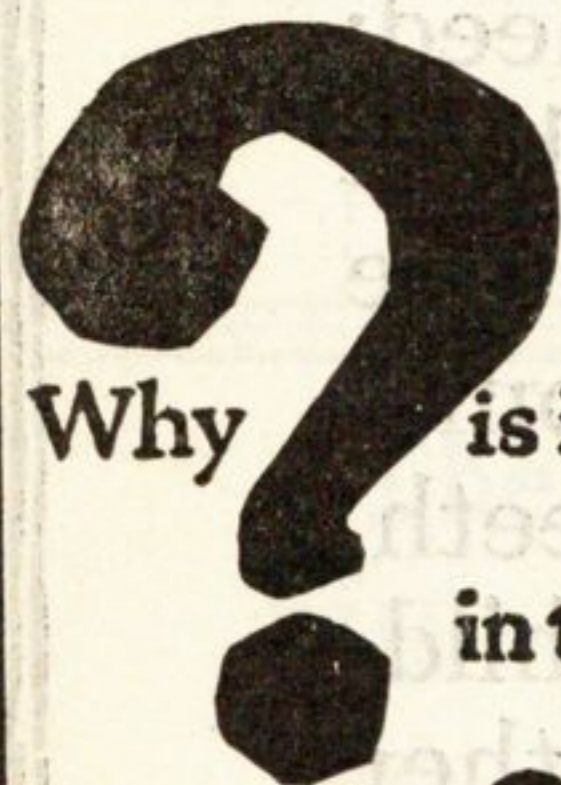
