The complete cast was announced this week for the Community Drama club's opening production of "A Successful Calamity," which was written by Clare Kummer and originally produced in 1917 at the Booth theatre, New York, with William Gillette, Estelle Winwood and Roland Young in the leading parts.

Three of the cast of "Officer 666," produced last spring, will have leading parts in "A Successful Calamity." William Boyden, Jr., will take the part of Henry Wilton. This is the part played by Mr. Gillette in the original production and calls for some very clever work. Charles Matz will have the part of "Eddie" and Charles J. Eastman, who has appeared in several of the Theatre Guild productions, as well as a number of plays put on by the Community Drama club, will take the part of Clarence Rivers, which was originally played by Roland Young.

Miss Harding Has Role

Miss Mary Harding will be seen in the part of "Albertine," a French maid and Mr. Varney will play "Pietro Raffaelo." Mr. Varney has been seen in a number of plays in Winnetka including "Green Stockings," produced last year. Both of these parts have great comedy possibilities.

The part of "Emmie," the young wife, will be in the hands of Miss Vogel, while Miss Helen Davis will play "Marguerite," Wilton's daughter. The very important part of "Connors," the butler, will be taken by Lloyd Faxon, who was also in "Green Stockings" and had a "bit" in "The Red Robe." Comedy in Two Acts

Rehearsals are under the direction of Mrs. John Marshall, who has appeared in many productions during the past few years. The play will be given at the Community House on November 13.
