Rt. Hon. Herbert A. L. Mr. Fisher passed through Chicago last Wednesday evening and said his summons was imperative and much as he regretted

the unexpected call from home, he felt it his duty to respond without delay.

It had been hoped he could hasten his six lectures and by giving two a day, complete the course on "The World's Outlook" within the next few days or by next Tuesday, at the latest, but the last message from England was so imperative that even this plan had to be abandoned.

Northwestern university through its administrative officers and faculties has expressed the keenest disappointment over Mr. Fisher's withdrawal.

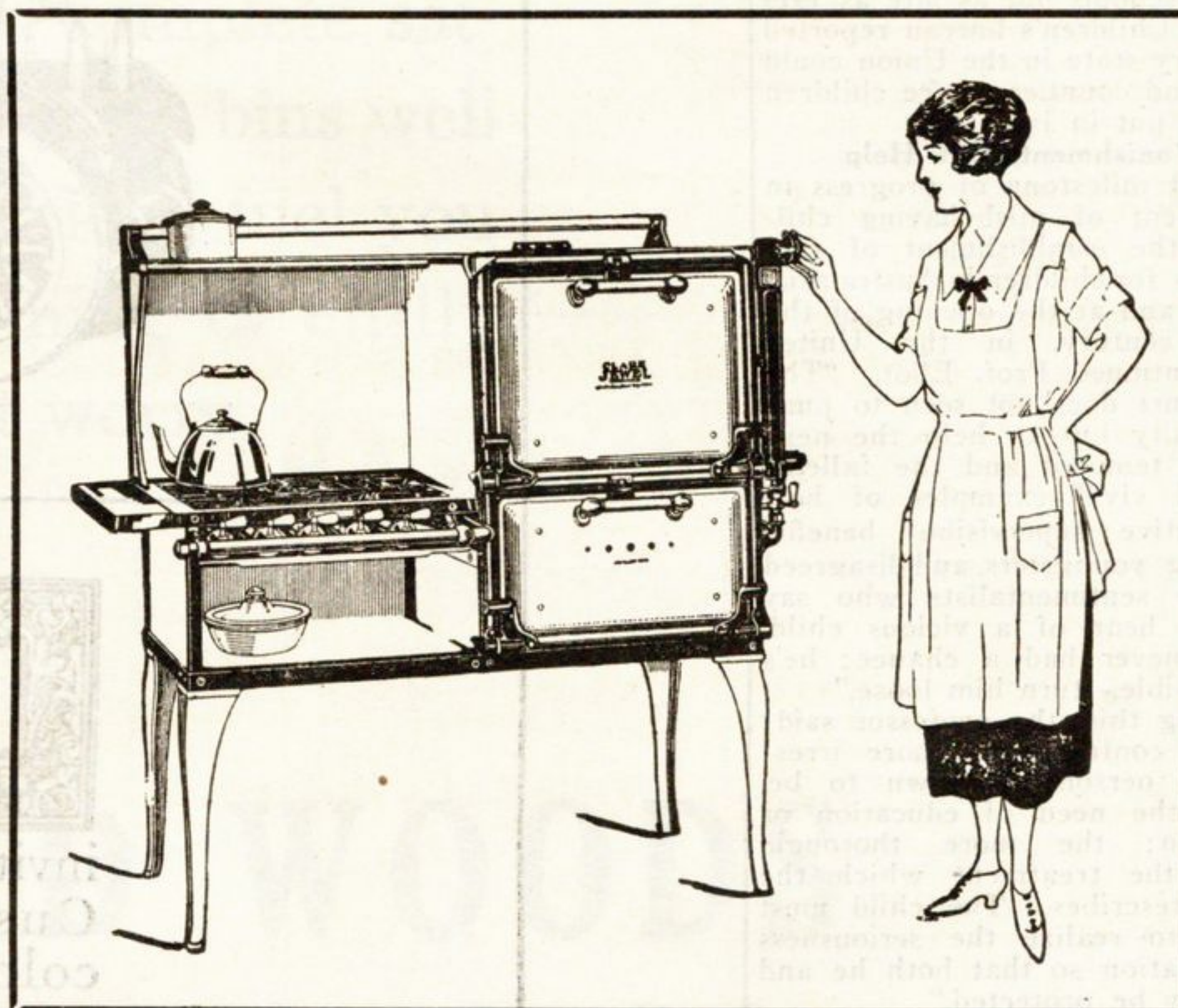
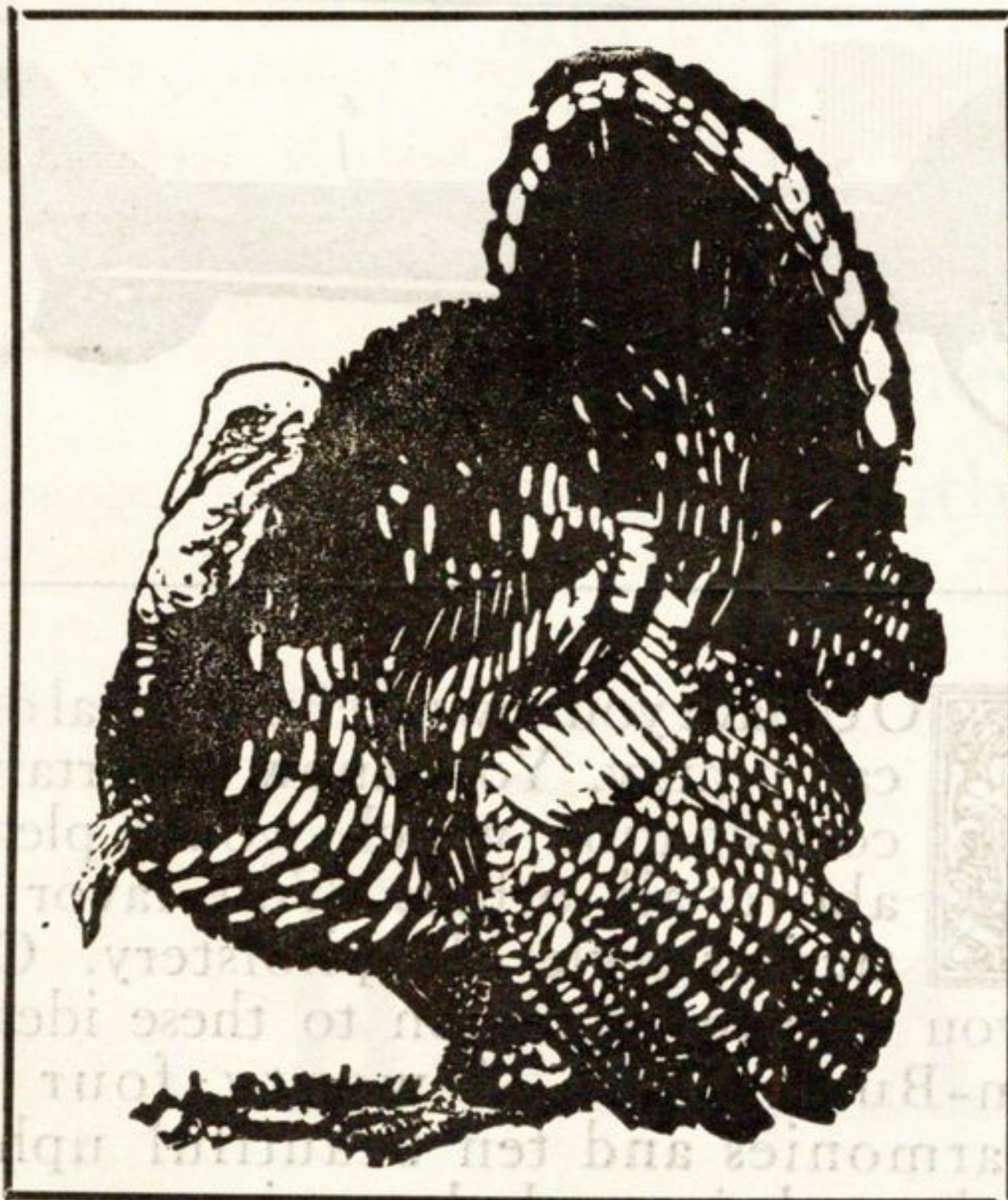
