
#### Meet Mr. Inx

The source of house-to-house solicitation for "disabled veterans," a practice condemned by Winnetka Post of the American Legion through the columns of WINNETKA TALK several months ago, was discovered in Chicago this week when uniformed solicitors admitted they are in the employ of a man who supplied their wares and later "split with them on a 50-50 basis." In other words, the "disabled veterans" in this instance, were a myth and the proceeds from the sales were amassing a comfortable fortune for an able-bodied schemer.

Winnetka Post has repeatedly warned local householders against patronizing these house-to-house solicitors who usually appear in army garb and enter a plea for aid for disabled men. It now appears that the Chicago police have checked at least one source of this common fraud.

It is emphasized that aid for disabled war veterans comes through the channels of the American Legion and other recognized agencies, so that panhandling solicitation is entirely unnecessary. Needy disabled men or their families may secure immediate relief by applying to the American Legion, Red Cross, or other legitimate organ-


izations.



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
