### "Richard, the Lion-Hearted" Here Tuesday

What are said to be two very excellent motion picture productions will be offered at Community House next week when "Richard, the Lion-Hearted," is to be the feature of Tuesday's performances and "Secrets" at the Friday shows.

"Richard, the Lion-Hearted" is a rare pictorial romance taken from Sir Walter Scott's novel "The Talisman". It is the story of England's most popular king as he wages wars on infidel hordes and struggles against treachery and intrigue in his army camps.

Friday's picture, "Secrets," presents Norma Talmadge in the stellar role, assisted by Eugene O'Brien.

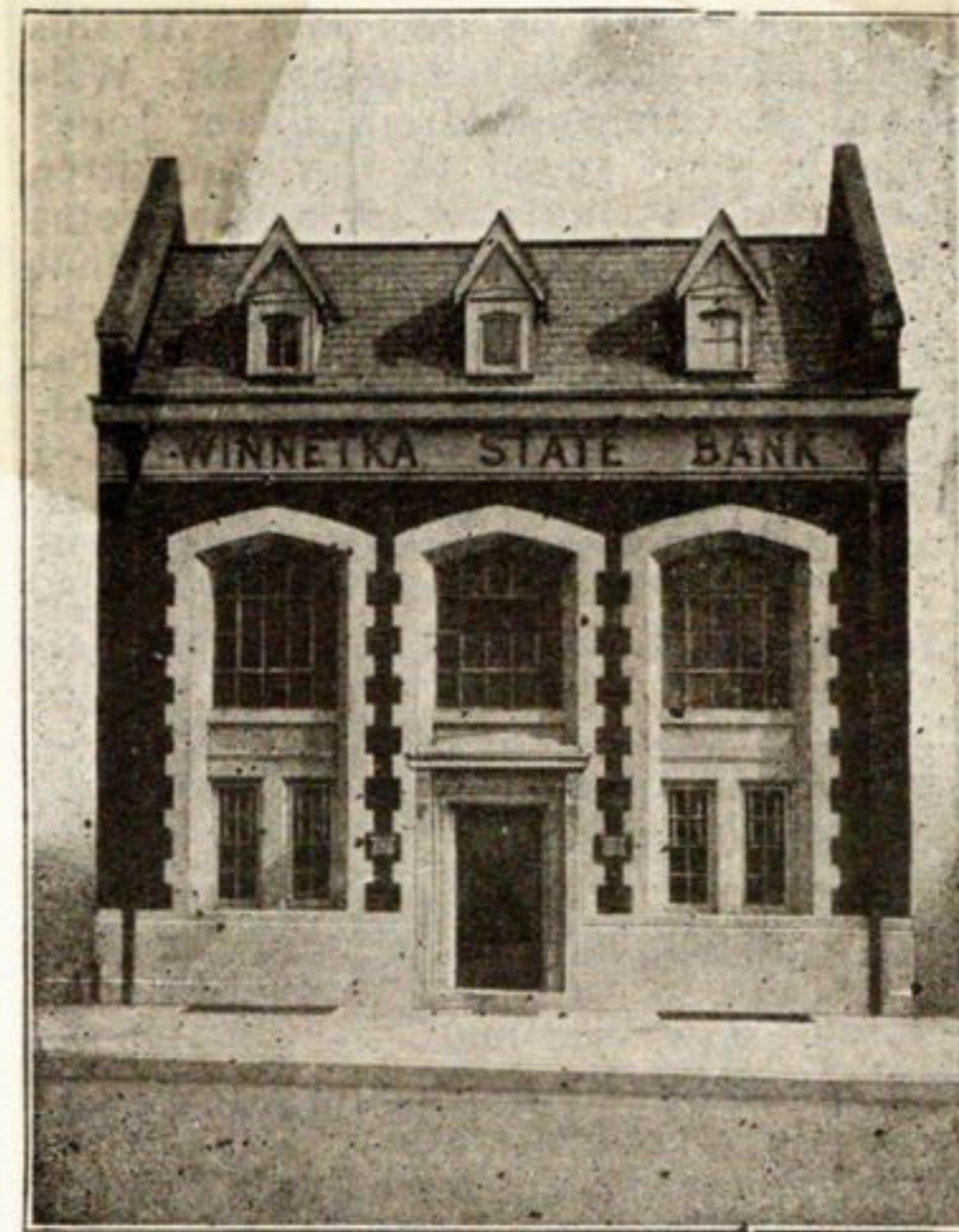
