
ALTER DATE OF FIFTH CONCERT

Points out Dangers of Sleighing Behind Autos

Bob-sleigh riding behind automobiles should not be permitted, according to Dr. M. J. Bradley of the chemistry department of the University of Illinois, unless the cars are provided with a special exhaust pipe. The deadly fumes of carbon monoxide otherwise are inhaled by the occupants of the sled, he explains, and if the rope is short enough, death may occur in a few moments because the exhaust is being breathed directly.

The first symptom is generally a slight headache, then dizziness and suffocation with chills and numbness. Any concentration of carbon monoxide above four parts per 10,000 of air is dangerous if inhaled more than a few breaths. The exhaust from the automobile engine has many times this concentration.

The only way to prevent possible gas poisoning is to extend the exhaust pipe from the muffler upward until it reaches the top of the car thus exhausting the fumes and gases high into the air where concentration gradually decreases due to diffusion and air currents caused by the moving machine. Any car not equipped in this way should not be permitted to draw persons on sleds, said Mr. Bradley. This sport is also dangerous because of accidents which might occur with other passing vehicles and private chauffeur in a prominent Winespecially when turning corners.


