Mr. 'Billing's portrayal of Lincoln makes this characterization one of the most outstanding of the film art.

"With a few well-chosen scenes, Lincoln's birth and babyhood are shown. Then Abe as a boy who does not like to kill animals, who worships his mother, and who, at the age of 10 years, does a man's work on the farm. His early disapproval of slavery is shown when Lincoln visits a slave auction in New Orleans and says, 'If I ever get a chance to hit this thing, I will hit it and hit it hard.

"Soon we see the beginning of his political career. The Lincoln of the public stumps making his short, concise speeches which carried such direct messages. We find him a Congressman at Washington, then back at the law office, and, as a result of his ever-growing popularity, his nomination and election to the Presidency.

"Next the Civil war, told in a few scenes which show great artistry and restraint but which present a most vivid and consecutive account of Lincoln's disappointments, his joys, and finally his great speech at Gettysburg.




