

Schools Now Engaged in Taking Census of Village

Carleton W. Washburne, superintendent of schools in Winnetka, is putting into effect a new plan for taking the village school census which is required by law every year. He is sending out postal cards to all persons whose names appear on the village water or light bills, and to all those whose names appeared in a previous village census.

Arrangements have also been made to get the names of all those who apply for building permits. It has been the custom formerly to take the census in the summer months, employing students for the purpose. This method was found to be expensive and inefficient, as many families are away in the summer and incorrect information is sometimes given by neighbors. The new methods will prove much quicker and more accurate, in the opinion of the village authorities.


