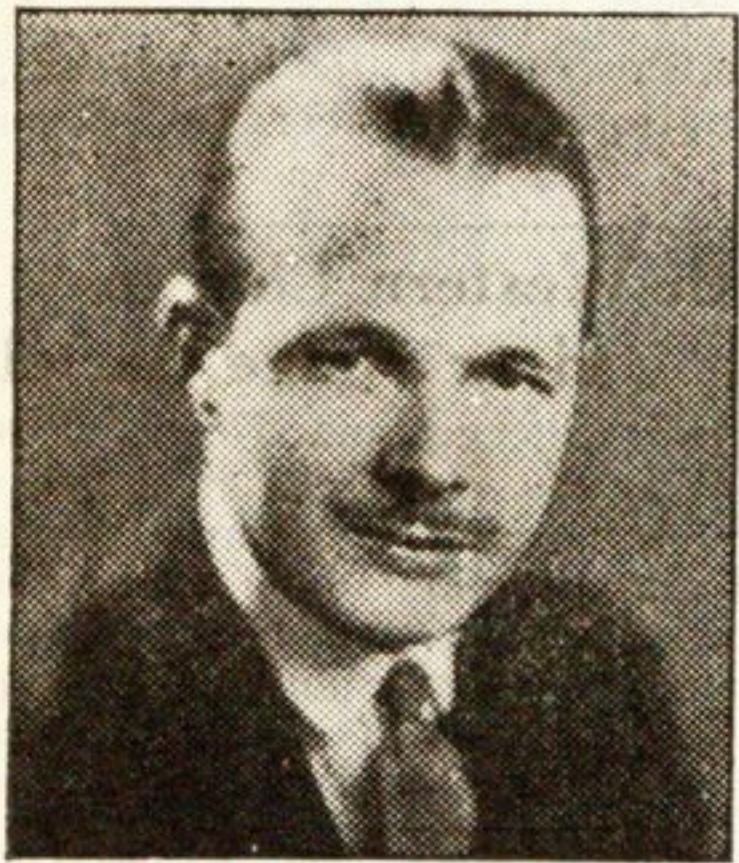


# OPTICAL FIRM HAS BIRTHDAY

**Hattstrom and Sanders Completes First Year**

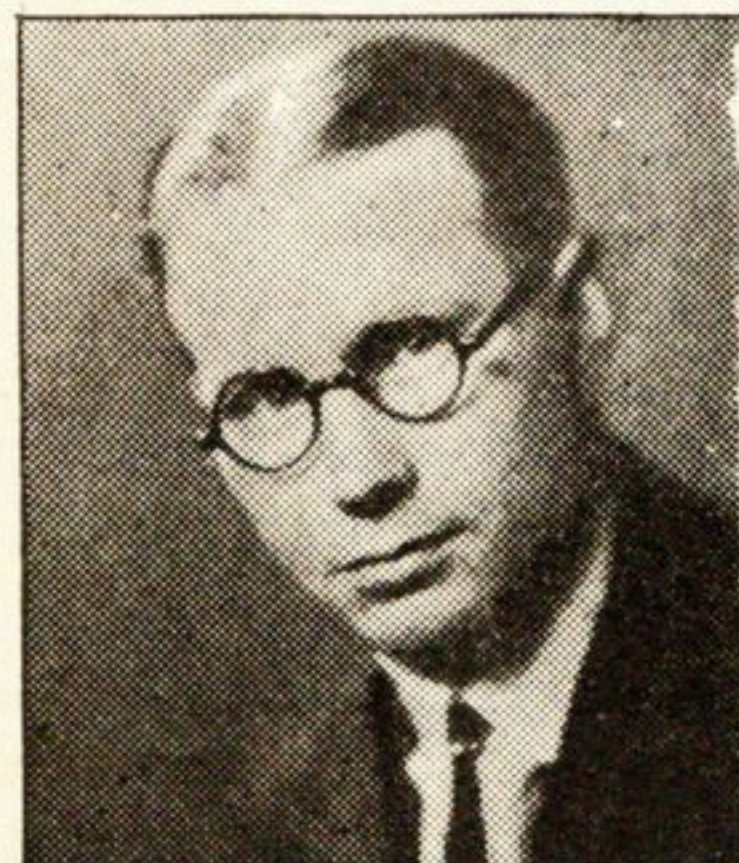
One year in business—and a business that has prospered in a remarkable way—is being commemorated in the firm of Hattstrom and Sanders,

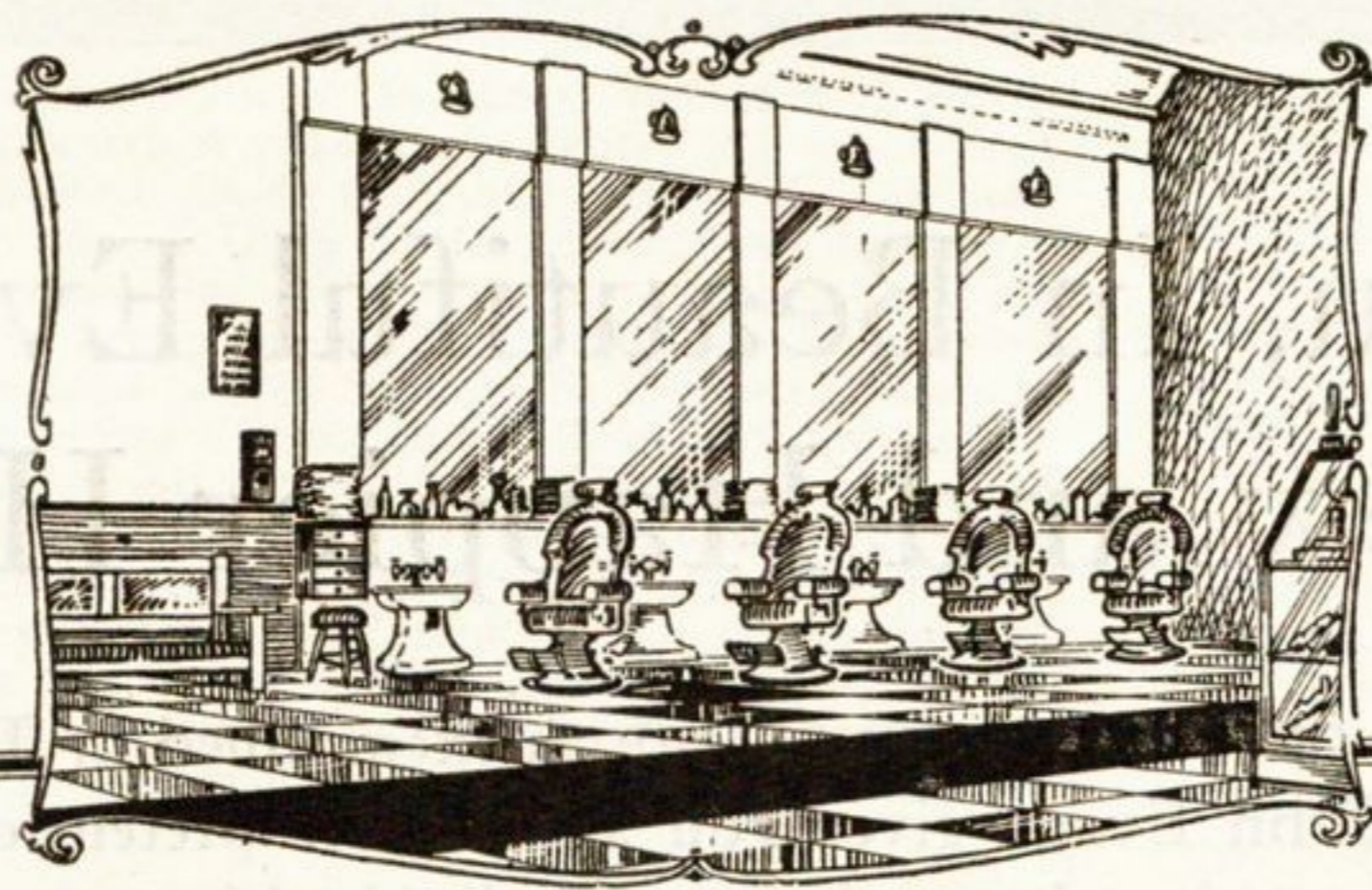
