
PARISH IS HOST TO MISSIONARY

Modern Missionary

Mr. Pye is a "modern," he told some of the women last Wednesday that he was surprised to find people in America who think it is the missionary's job to spend his time preaching to the heathen. "That is as modern as an ox team would be on your Sheridan road," he said. "In that country where it has become necessary to hold men back from the Christian church, and to limit the numbers who may join, just for lack of enough leaders, the missionary's job is preeminently to find the able men and train them in leadership."

Dearth of Workers

One such Chinese leader told Mr. Pye lately that in his center he could receive 20,000 church members next year, if he had the place and the men to take care of such big numbers. "And think of a hundred 'bachelor' churches, all men and not a woman," he exclaimed.

Not churches alone, but schools, colleges, hospitals, farmers' conferences, government road building—everything that helps make life better and more civilized, is now a part of the "day's work" of the missionary, Mr. Pye explains. It makes a fascinating story.

Young people and older—everybody—it is felt will be glad of this chance to hear the man who "with a rule and a map" has opened to the modern world a new country and gives us a glimpse of it.






