Mr. and Mrs. Harry Marshall of 564 Arbor Vitae road left Friday for a month's rest in the South.

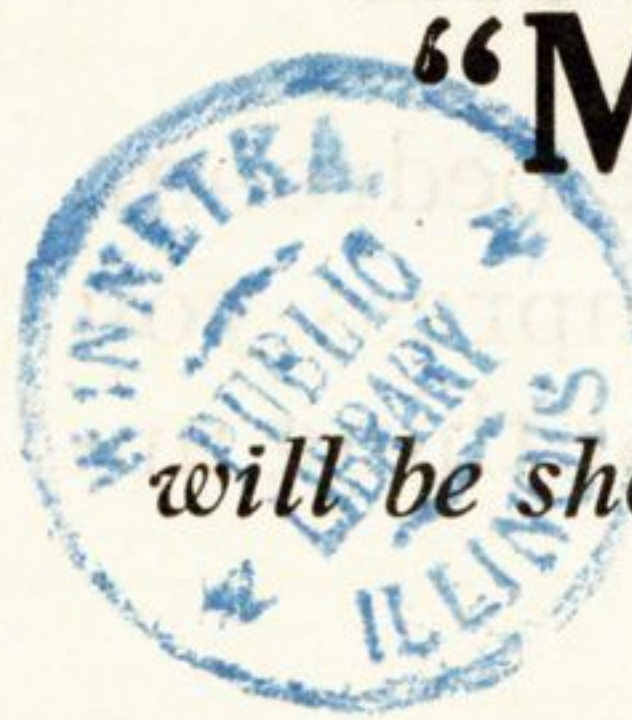
Robert DePau, 724 Center street, arrived home from Beloit college, Friday, for his spring vacation.
