

CLOSE SYMPHONY YEAR WEDNESDAY

Dasch Players to Appear for Last Time This Season in Exceptional Concert

ENLARGE ORCHESTRA

Last Opportunity to Subscribe Wednesday

The Symphony season on the north shore will close Wednesday, April 15, when the final concerts of the third season, both matinee and evening, will be given by the Symphony Players of Chicago, under the direction of George Dasch, at the New Trier high school auditorium.

Each succeeding season of the Orchestra association has been more successful than the preceding, both in point of the size of the orchestra and the scope of the repertoire. The management of the association has planned still greater things for the season of 1925-1926, especially in respect to the matinees. At a recent meeting of the board of directors, it was unanimously decided to increase the number of players in the orchestra for the matinees from the present 25, to 40 or 45. This will place the matinees on practically the same musical standard as the evening concerts and will make the afternoon meetings particularly attractive to women who have not been able to attend the evening concerts.

Members Renew Subscriptions

As previously announced, the success of the evening season next year has been assured by the large number of subscriptions already received. There are a few old subscribers in each village of the township who have neglected to express their wishes, but these will be given an opportunity to sign up next Wednesday evening. After that date, vacancies will be allotted to the large waiting list.

The hour of the matinee on Wednesday has been set for 4:30 instead of 4 o'clock—the hour of previous concerts. The evening hour is as heretofore—at 8:15 o'clock.

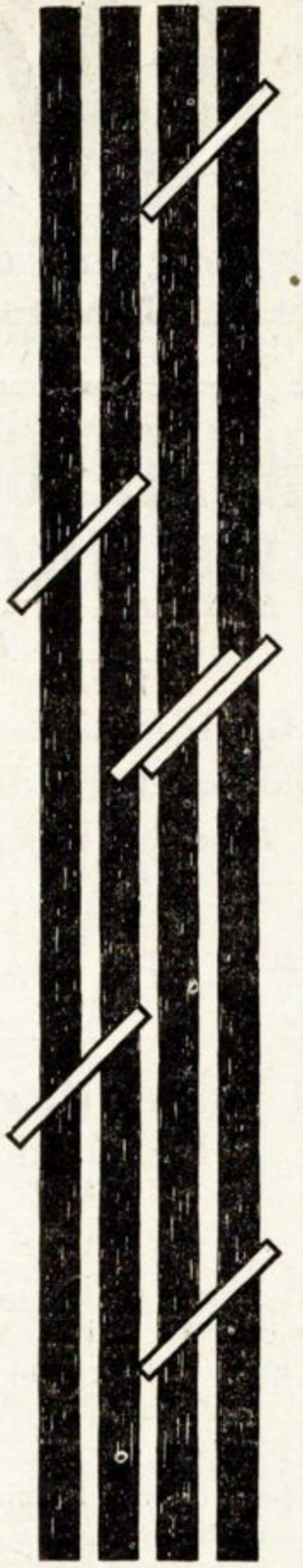

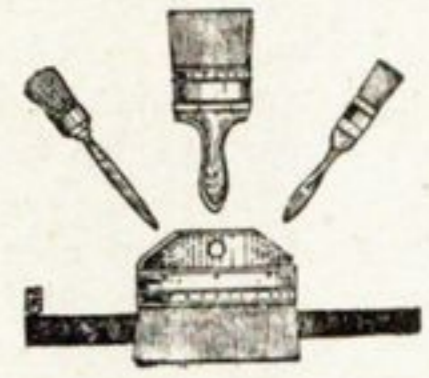
