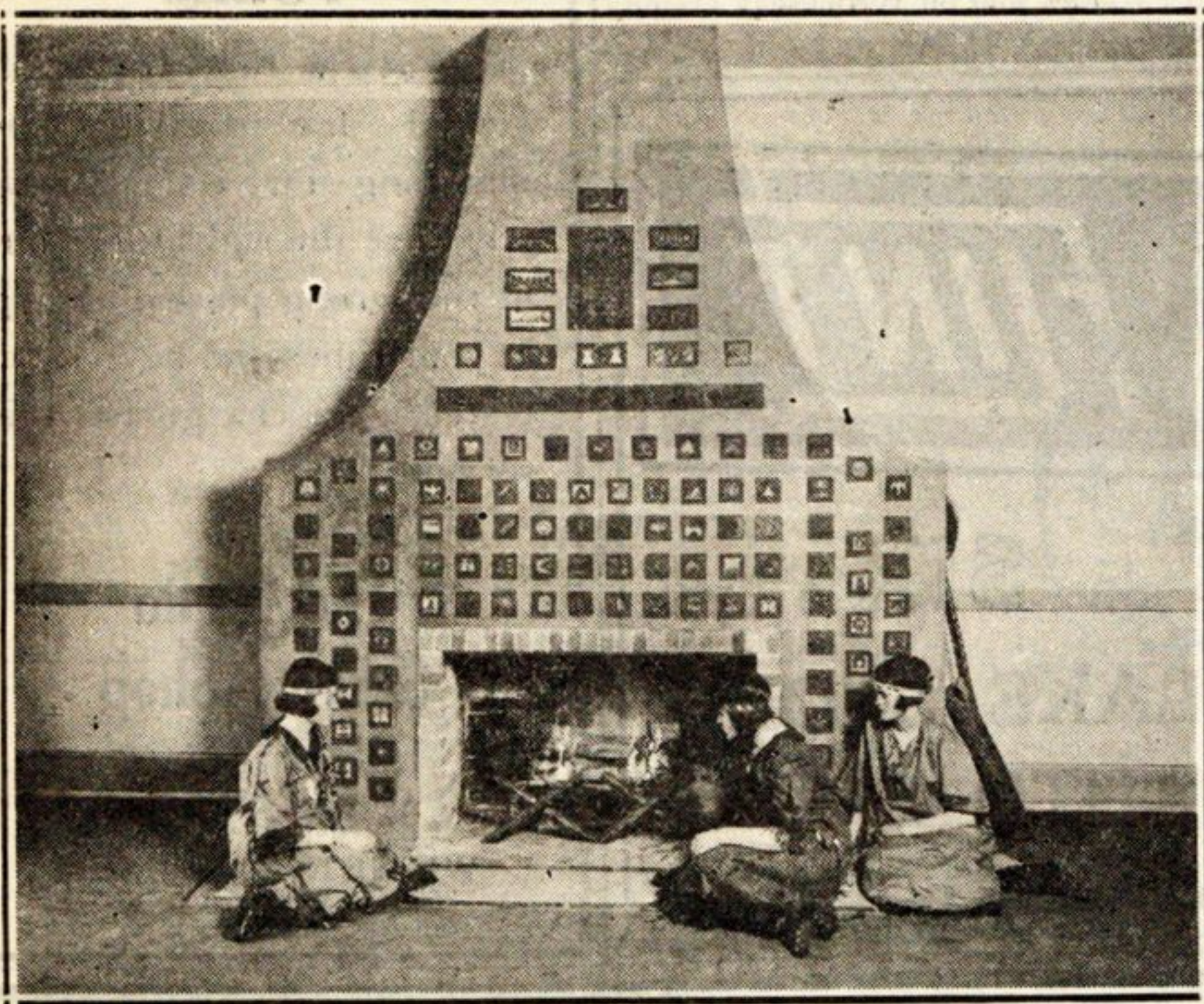


## Marvels at Camp Fire Hearth

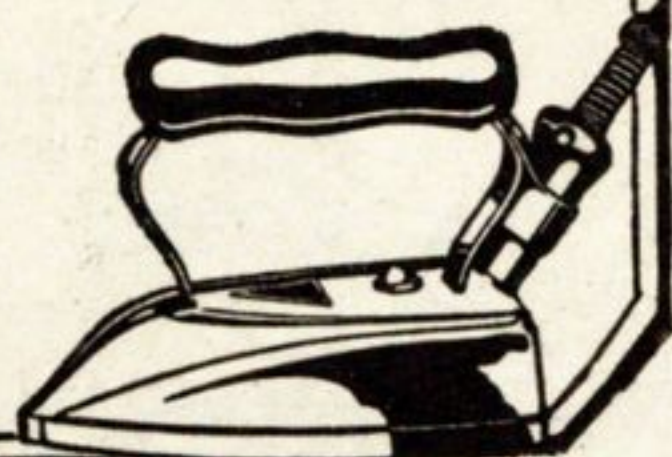
