

Collections of not to exceed \$10, fee increased from 10 cents to 12 cents; collections not to exceed \$50, fee increased from 10 cents to 12 cents; collections not to exceed \$50, fee increased from 10 cents to 15 cents; collections not to exceed \$100, fee unchanged at 25 cents.

Under the new law there will be no change from the present 10-cent charge for special delivery of letters and for packages of less than 2 pounds. Mail weighing more than 2 pounds and not more than 10 pounds will require a special delivery stamp of 15 cents instead of 10 cents. A charge of 20 cents for a special delivery stamp on mail weighing more than 10 pounds instead of 10 cents will be imposed under the law effective April 15.
