The lines of the hull of the new craft will closely follow those of the famous Gogstad viking ship built a thousand years ago, a replica of which was sailed and rowed from Norway to Chicago in 1893, and which is now at Lincoln Patk.

An interesting coincidence is that Washington Island and the country in the immediate vicinity of the camp was settled by direct descendents of the vikings, coming from Iceland about 60 years ago. Many of the famed viking names, such as Sigurdson, Gudmunder, Einarson and others may still be found on the hotels and stores of Washington Island, and many of the original Icelanders are still alive. It is interesting to speculate on the memories that will be aroused in them at sight of a craft similar to those that carried their ancestors on their historic voyages.




