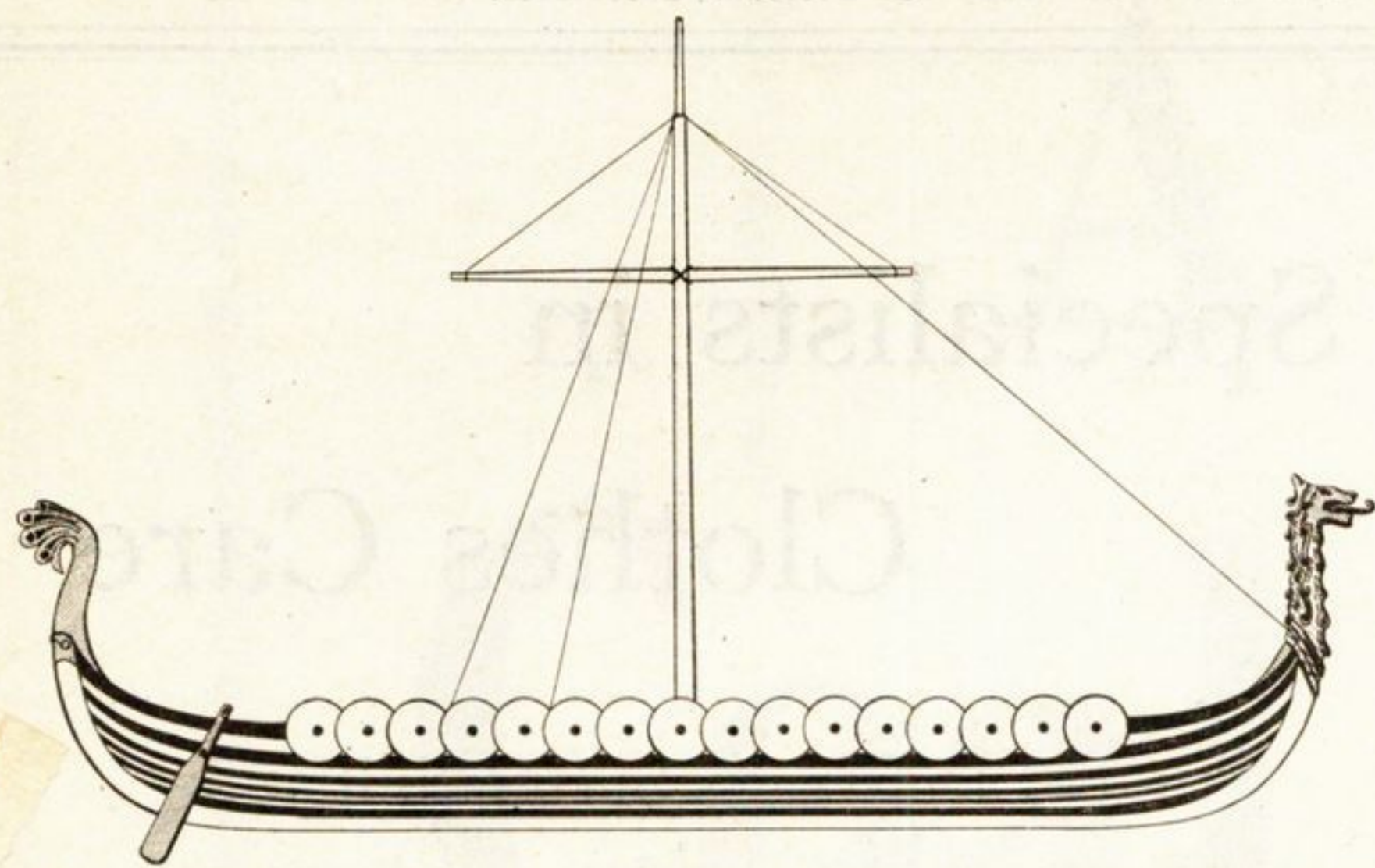


**"Vikings" Come to Our Shores**

**Two Men Injured When Automobiles Collide**

Plamondon was driving a Hudson car south on Maple avenue when he collided with Kragchavch's Ford car which was traveling west on Pine street. Both cars were seriously damaged.

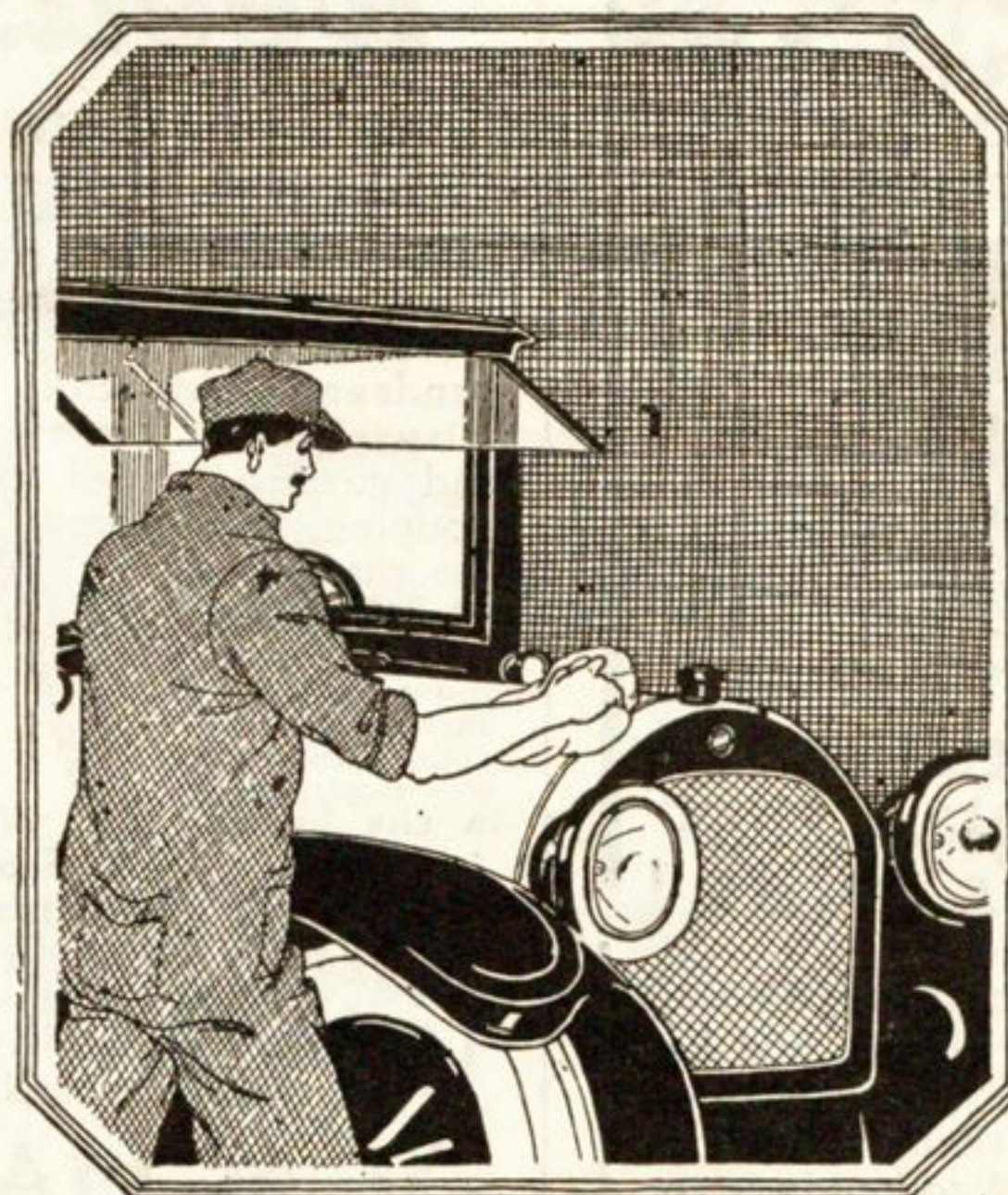
