Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Rice, 994 Spruce street, left Wednesday last for Toledo where they will spend the week-end with friends.

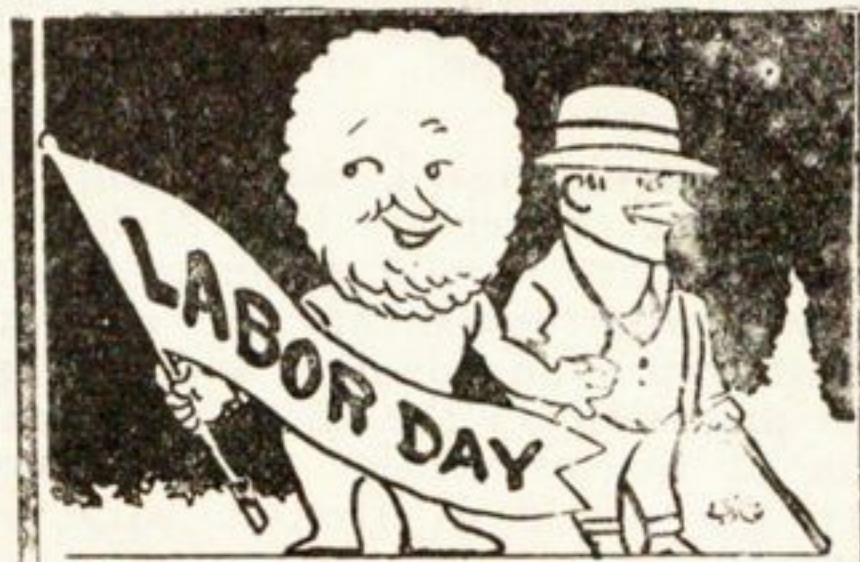
William Taylor, 508 Cherry street, has returned from business trip to Pittsburgh.

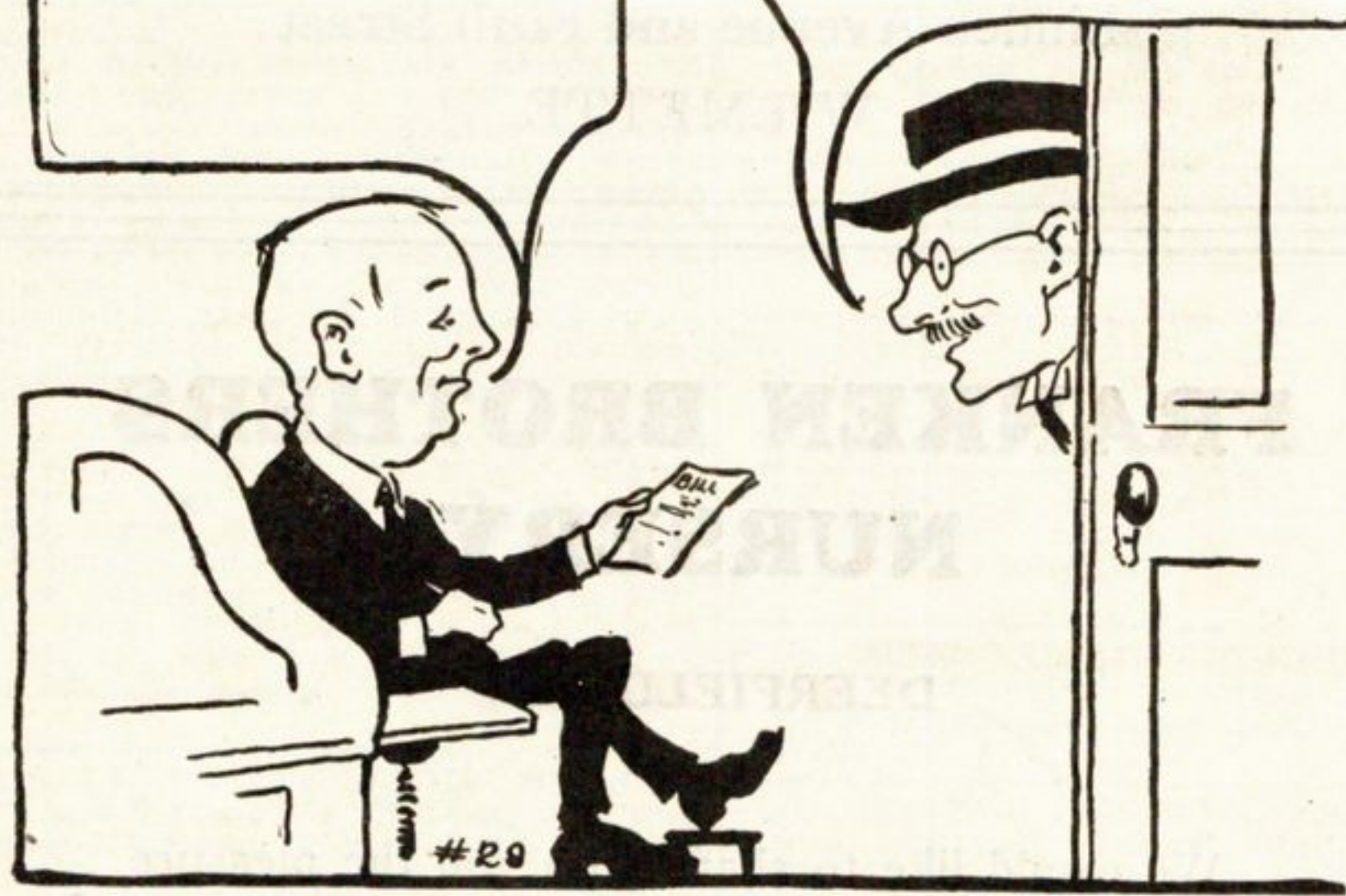
