### Tourists Bombard Motor Club for Travel Advice

Predictions as to the probable increase in touring during 1925 as compared with 1924 made at the beginning of the year placed the increase at 25 per cent. A recent analysis of the calls received by the touring bureau of the Chicago Motor club for the first four months of the year shows that the estimate was far too low, the touring bureau reports an increase of 104.9 per cent for this period. This is the most pronounced increase in touring ever recorded by the club in any year since 1906.

The requests for long distance tours have had a tremendous increase, and this was noticeable even during the winter months of January and February. The South, which has been considered the playground for motorists only for winter months is rapidly becoming popular in the warm months. 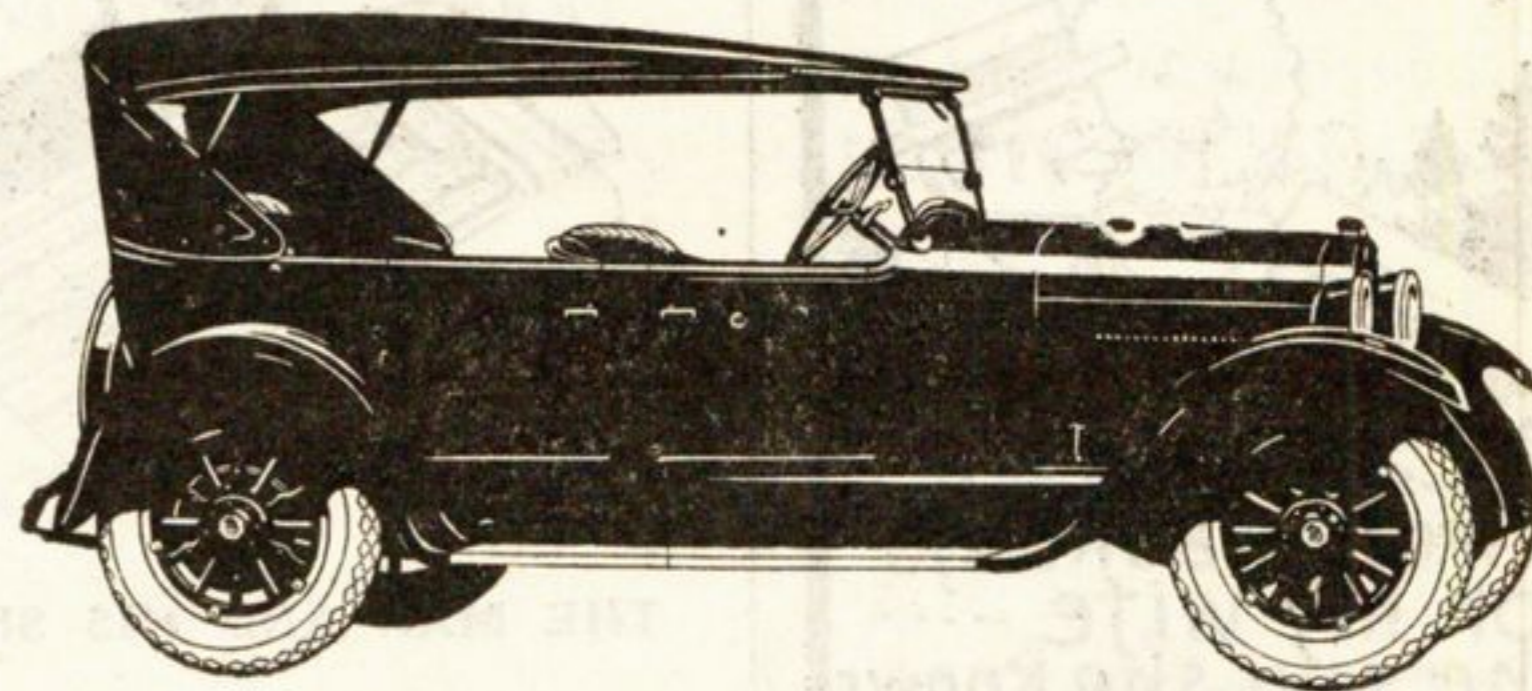

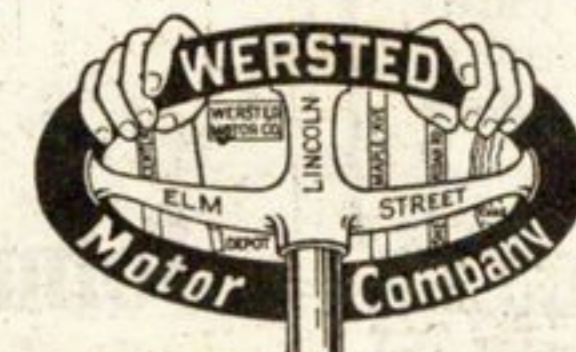
