Eighteen Children Enroll on Opening Day

Eighteen Winnetka children enrolled in the Daily Vacation Church school out and raised. in Christ Church Parish House Monday of this week. The attendance will be greatly augmented, it is said, since the church expects to provide trans-portation for children living too far distant from the Parish House to make the journey by foot:

The school comprises junior, primary and kindergarten departments and begins session at 9 o'clock every morning, Saturday and Sunday excepted.

Sessions begin with worship, followed by a study period and time devoted to expression work. There are games out-of-doors.

The juniors are given a Bible drill, while the primary children enjoy stories. Assembly is at 11:45 when the chil-

dren salute the flag and have the closing exercises.

Work in the Kindergarten is similar to that in the upper classes. Lack of transportation facilities ap-

pears to have prevented the attendance of many children. If there is sufficient demand from prospective pupils living a considerable distance from the Parish House, the school leaders will arrange for a bus to call at the homes. 
