Young Women Return From Interesting Work

The Misses Jessie and Blanche Gay, 921 Twelfth street, returned recently from a two years' stay in the Hawaiian Islands, where they were engaged in social service work. They gave friends an interesting account of conditions there, and told of some things which are not generally known.

The large plantations there, they said, are not owned by private owners, but by corporations. The natives are very proud of their American citizenship and do not like it when any one forgets that the Islands are as much

a part of the United States as any of her states.

The sisters originally went to the islands on a pleasure trip, but were so interested in what they saw there that they desired to stay longer, and, through Donald Bowman, who is in charge of social service work, Miss Blanche was made superintendent of

the hospital on the Pashua plantation, and Miss Jessie became secretary to the manager.

The Pashua plantation is the last word in modern conveniences, they said. The hospital had 20 beds and a modern operating room as any that could be found in a hospital of its size in the United States.
