

## Noted Young Artist to Sing at Children's Day Concert

CLARA BLOOMFIELD, a niece of Fannie Bloomfield Ziesler, well known pianist, will give the following program at Ravinia Park, Thursday afternoon, July 30, at 3 o'clock:

The ensuing notice says of Miss Bloomfield:

"Clara Bloomfield, concert singer, received her training from the greatest masters. She first studied with Lombardi in Florence, Italy. In the United States she was one of the very few pupils of Madame Schumann-Heinck and studied further with Madame Marcella Sembrich and Yvette Guilbert. During the last few years, she has sung with great success in many of the most important musical centers of Europe.

"Clara Bloomfield has specialized in the dramatic interpretation of the folk-songs of England and the European continent and includes also in her repertoire, American Negro spirituals and Indian folksongs. She has been much praised for the skill and intelligence with which she brings out the appealing charm, now wistful, and now intensely dramatic, of these poems and melodies. Among them it is the children's songs, for the most part neglected by musicians, but kept alive by generations of mothers, which Clara Bloomfield is almost alone in singing with an artist's revelation of beauty."

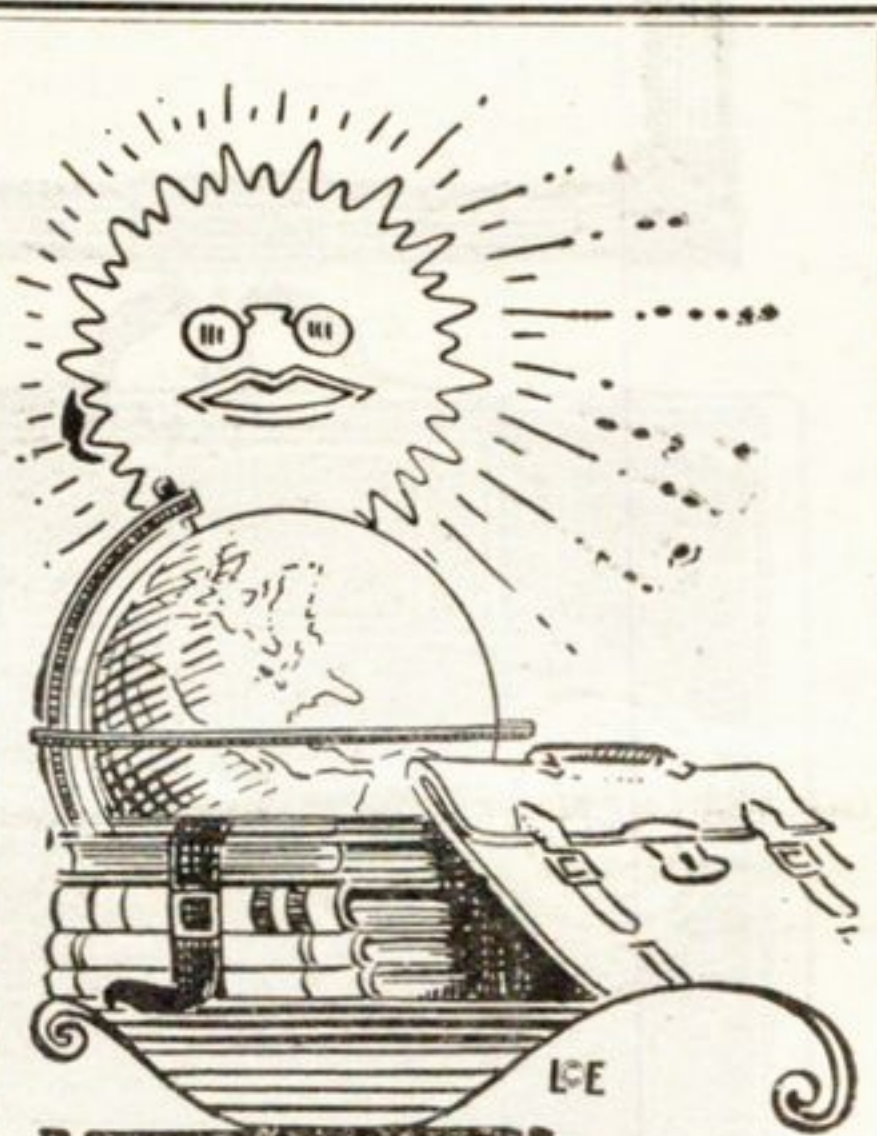
