McCormick Boulevard to Receive Traffic in November, Engineer Reports

GATE TO NORTH ROUTE

Channel Route Will Relieve Congestion

McCormick boulevard flanking the Drainage channel, will be open for use by November 1, according to present plans announced by Phillip Harrington, a lieutenant to Chief Engineer Kelly of the Sanitary district which is building the highway.

The stretch of paving along the west side of the roadway from Main to W. Stop at W. Railroad

No plans have been formulated for carrying the boulevard beyond W. Railroad avenue, Evanston. Mr. Harrington explained that the Sanitary district has no power to create a connecting link between the highway and the Green Bay road. Some other organization must eventually undertake the task. This the county and New Trier villages propose to do.

When the highway is opened in the late fall, it will be necessary to detour around the North Western railroad crossing at Oakton street, Evans-

The railroad and the Sanitary district have agreed to construct a subway at the crossing, but the state commerce commission has not yet agreed to the proposal. The delay may make it impossible to finish the subway by the time the rest of the highway is ready for use.

Plan North Highway

Evanston is considering widening W. Railroad avenue from the terminal of the highway north to the city limits. The present road is too narrow to be adequate to meet present and future traffic needs. The proposed through highway to the north county line would connect with W. Railroad avenue at the Evanston north limits and extend along the west border of the North Western right-of-way.
