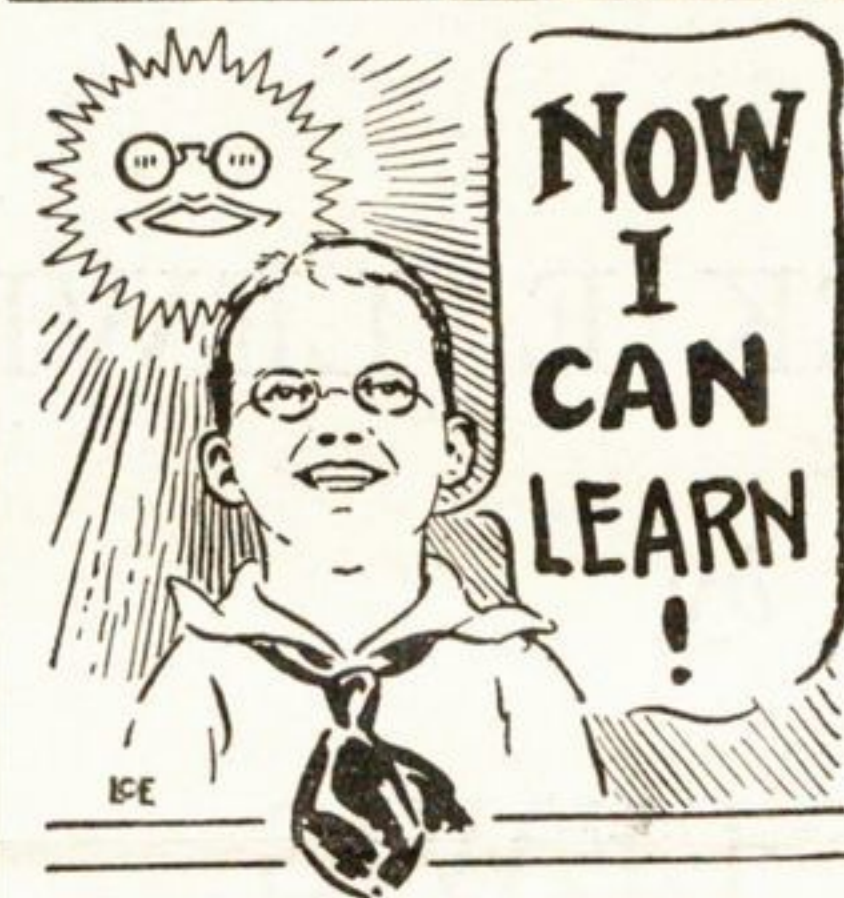
## Women Golfers Compete for Cup at North Shore

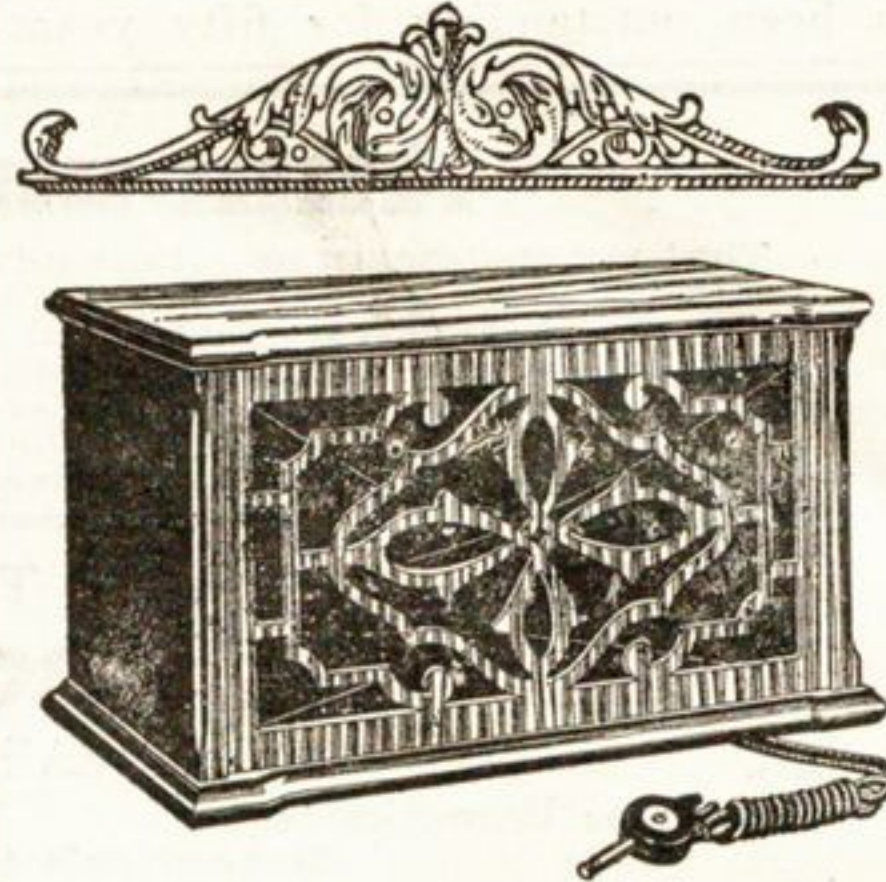

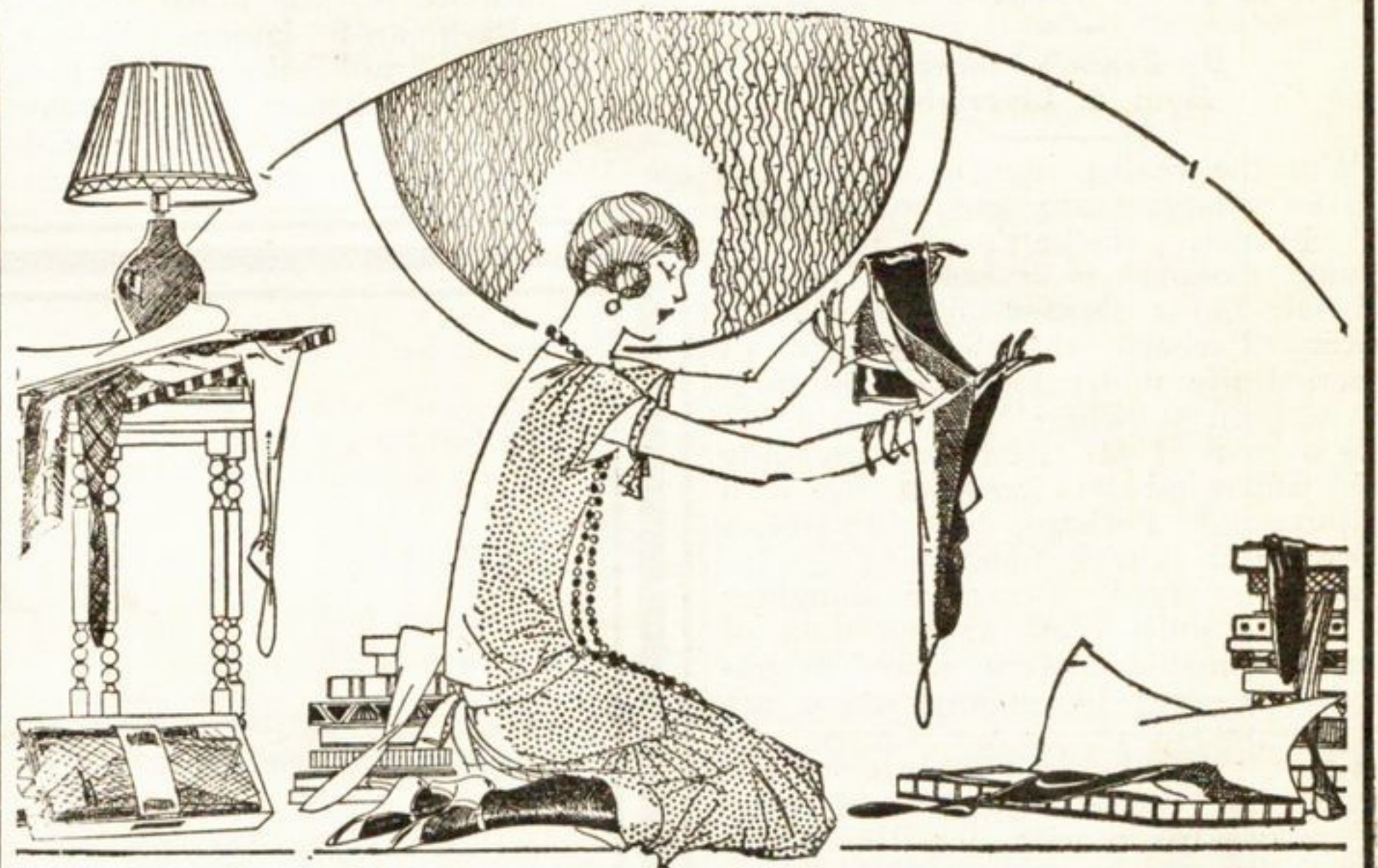
