

"ZANDER" FILM COMES FRIDAY

Marion Davies to Be Seen at Community House

Two popular screen stars will appear at Community House next week when Hoot Gibson in "Let 'Er Buck" is featured on Tuesday and Marion Davies in "Zander the Great" occupies the feature position at the Friday performances.

"Let 'Er Buck" is really two pictures in one and both are full of thrills. 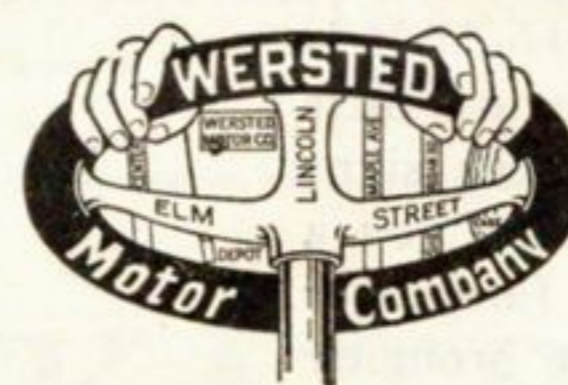
