Mrs. H. W. Armstrong, 365 Sheridan road, entertained 20 guests at dinner Friday, October 2, preceding the Cradle ball.



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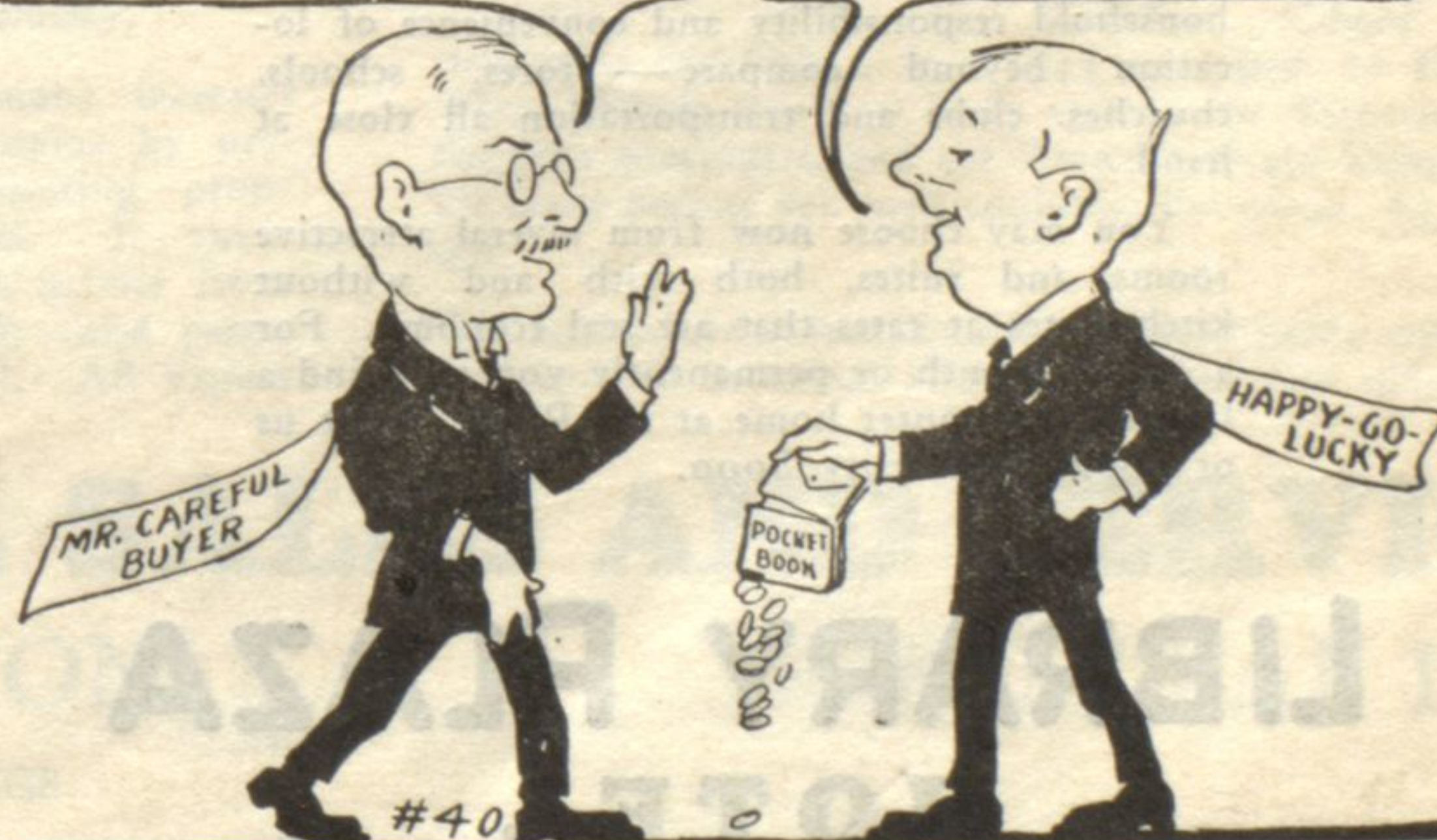
