Prime of Life Easiest Prey of Fatal Accidents

Approximately one fatality out of each five among persons between 20 and 50 years of age is caused by violence—accident, murder, suicide—according to the annual mortality statistics for Illinois released this week by Dr. Isaac D. Rawlings, state health director. Violence outranks by far any other single means of demise among people in the most productive period of life. Heart disease, nephritis and cancer, the three leading causes of death last year in the order listed, do 80 per cent of their destructive work among those who are more than 50 years of age, leaving violence, which ranked fourth among mortality causes, to wield the fatal sickle among the younger, able-bodied population.

"Persons who contemplate buying insurance," said Dr. Rawlings in the report, "will profit by giving some

study to these mortality returns. The chances are 1 to 5 that everyone who succumbs between 20 and 50 years of age will be a victim of violent death. That is the ratio that prevailed in last year's figures and the accident rate is increasing annually, due chiefly to the motor car. Furthermore there are about 10 more or less serious accidental injuries for each accidental death.
