

Zuppke's Men May Have Tough Going With Butler Crew

Capt. "Red" Grange will lead the University of Illinois football team against Butler in the Illinois memorial stadium this Saturday afternoon, unless he happens to be crippled previously, perish the thought. This is what coach Bob Zuppke says. Assurance that "Red" will play will be a boon to thousands of fans who want to see the All-American back in action. This is the last chance to see Illinois at home before the Michigan game, October 24, as they journey to Iowa City October 17.

For two years now Grange has played against Butler. Two years ago the Bulldogs from Indianapolis had things about even when Zuppke inserted Grange, who turned the tide. Last year "Zup" did not take a chance with the alert Bulldogs from Hoosierdom and Grange played a good part of the game. There is no guarantee that the Hoosiers will prove easy. They slipped a victory over the Illini in 1922 while Bob Zuppke was down at the Yale-Iowa game obtaining first-hand information which enabled the Illini to play the champion Hawks to a standstill the next week.

This year, although Coach Page has lost Woods and Griggs, he still has such veterans as Nipper, Cecil, Mensel, Hitch, Woodling, Capt. Reickel, Kilgore, Puett, Mulholland, Northam and Paul. Butler in its opening game defeated Earlham 32 to 0 and the Illinois reports were to the effect that the Hoosiers looked pretty good. Therefore, the Illini will be surprised if they do not meet with some stubborn resistance.

A-B-C, is the slogan meaning Always be Careful, is to be carried to children of all ages in Chicago and Cook county for one year, through the efforts of a group of 100 business and professional men operating as the Citizens Child Safety Campaign committee. The campaign will differ from any campaign ever conducted in Chicago and probably any other big city in the country, in its method of instruction, its duration and its system of financing, it is said.

Visual education is the method to be employed primarily. Bright colored pictures will tell the story of how typical accidents happen and how they are avoided. The long tried method of preaching safety will be continued in a table of 12 commandments and in many slogans urging the child to caution and pointing out the proper things to do and not to do in crossing streets and handling traffic situations. A catchy song, "The Meaning of Your A-B-C," carries a further lesson.

This instruction will be given through the medium of attractive four page books printed in four colors in handsome combinations to make each book a prize possession. One million of the books will be issued monthly with twelve million during the year of the campaign and with each new million there will be a complete change of lessons.
