

Plan School for Deaf Children in North Shore Homes

Mrs. Evalyn F. Houghton, supervisor of the speech department in school district No. 75, Evanston, has just completed a survey of the north shore for the purpose of determining the number of deaf children who need special training. This survey was sponsored by the board of education of District No. 75 with a view to establishing a school for deaf children on the north shore.

The survey included Wilmette, Kenilworth, Winnetka and Glencoe only, but any children on the north shore would be eligible to membership. Mrs. Houghton said that a surprising number of children were found who needed special training in such schools. Many of these are getting no training at all now, and others are going to Chicago. The contemplated school would take care of children partially or completely deaf and also deaf mutes, besides which there would be classes in lip reading for any that wanted them. Further announcements concerning the school are expected shortly.
