Announces Recital
by Gifted Artists**

Miss Irma Goebel and Mrs. Louise Winter will give a recital for the Winnetka Woman's club Tuesday, October 27. Miss Goebel, the pianist on the program, has studied with several famous teachers, among whom were the Swiss pianist, Edwin Fischer; the composer, Franz Schrecker; Alexander Raab, Sigismund Stojowski of New York, and Harold Bauer. While in Europe she toured Greece and part of Germany, where she received among other press notices, the following: Athens, Greece, Script—"A most sympathetic pianist whom the audience recalled repeatedly." Elepheron Vima—"New and astonishing interpretations." Berlin, Germany, Die Neue Zeit—"Technically and extremely adroit and skillful pianist, who plays with the clearest feeling for musical form and phrasing."

Louise Winter, the soprano, is a pupil of Karleton Hackett, critic for the Chicago Evening Post; the late David Bispham, and Madame Valerie of New York. She sang recently for the Chicago Musicians' Club of Women, and has appeared several times as soloist with the Little Symphony orchestra. Ruth Miller in the Chicago Tribune states, "Her enunciation is excellent and interpretively she is an expert musician. The voice has power and volume and she exhibits great skill and intelligence in the use of her natural vocal endowments."
