

### Launch Fourth Year of Community Organ Recital Programs

The fourth season of the North Shore Community Organ concerts at St. Luke's church, Evanston, will open Tuesday, October 29 at 8 o'clock with one of the most important programs so far given in these free concerts.

The artist is Herbert E. Hyde, dean of the Illinois Chapter American Guild of Organists, and superintendent of the Civic Music Association of Chicago. He will play the little known but melodiously beautiful and distinctive Handel "Sixth Organ Concerto"; a "Gavotte" by Father Martini, contemporary of Handel and leader of the Italian school; and two numbers by Bach—the "Bourree" (3rd Violoncello Suite) and the "Tocatta and Fugue D Minor" which is one of the master's best known writings.

A group of short descriptive numbers by modern writers is followed by the Dubois transcription of the Wagner: "Introduction to the 3rd Act and Pilgrim's Chorus" (Tannhauser). The program ends with two numbers by the famous Frenchman, Charles Marie Widor of St. Sulpice, Paris—his "Andante Cantabile" (4th Symphony) and "Tocatta" (5th Symphony).

### Plan More Effective Milk Law for Village

Winnetka is to have a new milk ordinance patterned after the model milk ordinance drawn up by the Illinois health department. The health and safety committee of the Village council recommended the adoption of such an ordinance at the last council meeting and the village attorney was instructed to prepare an ordinance. The present ordinance is antiquated and almost useless, village officials said. The most important provision in the new ordinance is the establishment of pasteurization standards.

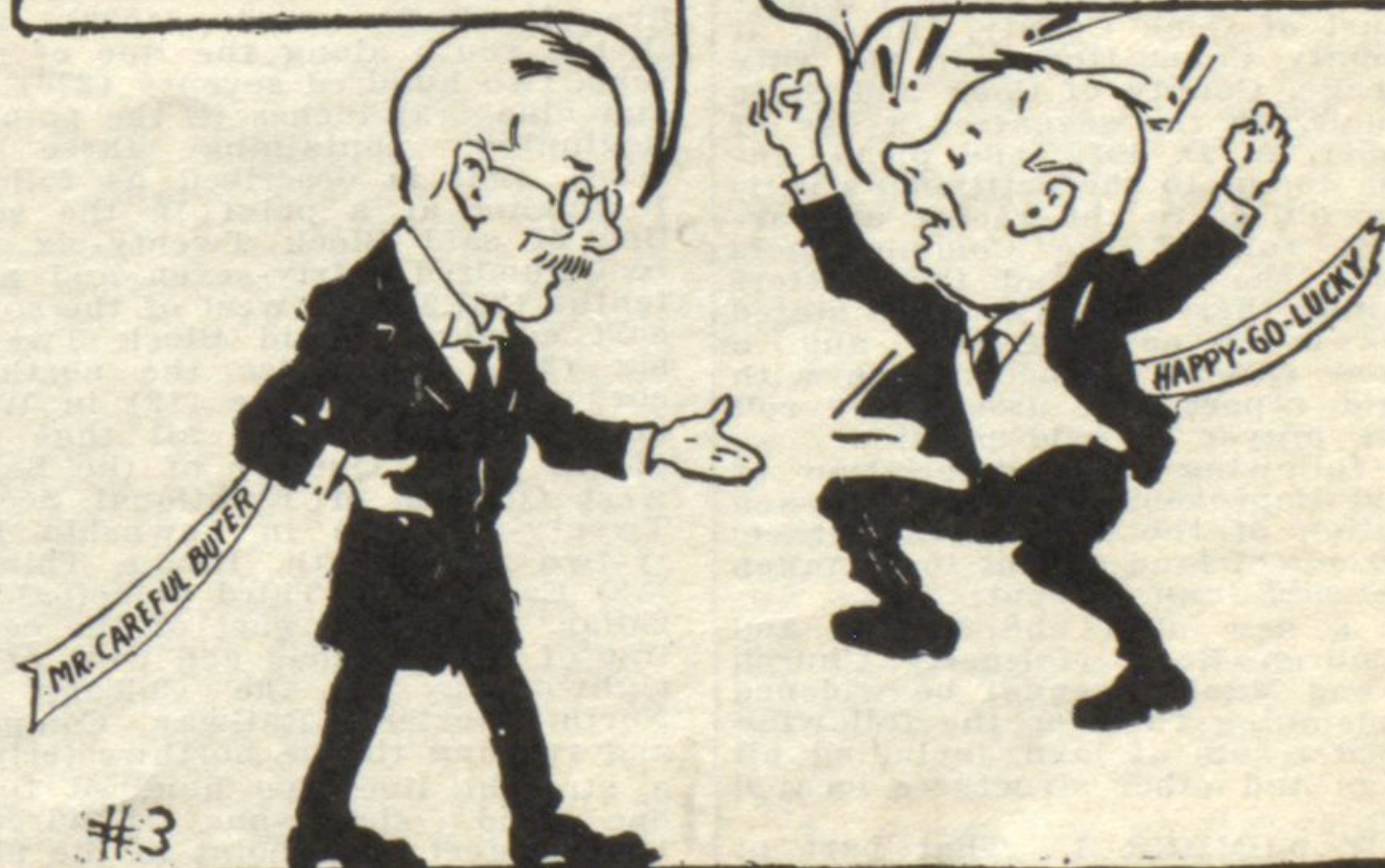
