

Realism, Its Place In Art, Subject of Next Dean Lecture

"Ibsen's technique and symbolism are obvious, his movements are apparent, his theatrical effects are clearly a playwright's artifice," according to Alexander Dean who gave an address on "Ibsen and the Drama of Ideas," in the Boy Scout room of Community House Wednesday afternoon at 3:30, as part of his series on Contemporary Drama, which is being given under the joint auspices of the Winnetka Woman's club and the Winnetka Community Drama club every Wednesday afternoon.

"Yet Ibsen is obscure," continued Mr. Dean. "It is impossible to understand the meaning of his plays."

"He was the first one to lift the drama from the muck of realism and to place his scenes in the living rooms of respectable middle class people. This was a revolutionary step at that time.

"Ibsen was the father of the Play of Ideas, but for that reason his plays are dated, since the customs and ideas of social life in one country or decade are seldom the same as they are in another country or decade."

Mr. Dean, who is well known for his work at Northwestern university and his direction of the North Shore Theatre Guild, will give the fourth lecture of his course on Contemporary Drama Wednesday afternoon, October 28, at 3:30 o'clock in the Boy Scout room at Community House.

He will talk on "Realism, Its Place in Art, Its Abuse, Its Development and

Its Future," and draw a comparison between Romanticism and Realism in drama.

There will also be a discussion of "Rain," the much talked of play that is in Chicago now after a long and successful run in New York.

These Wednesday afternoon lectures are open to the public for a small admission fee.

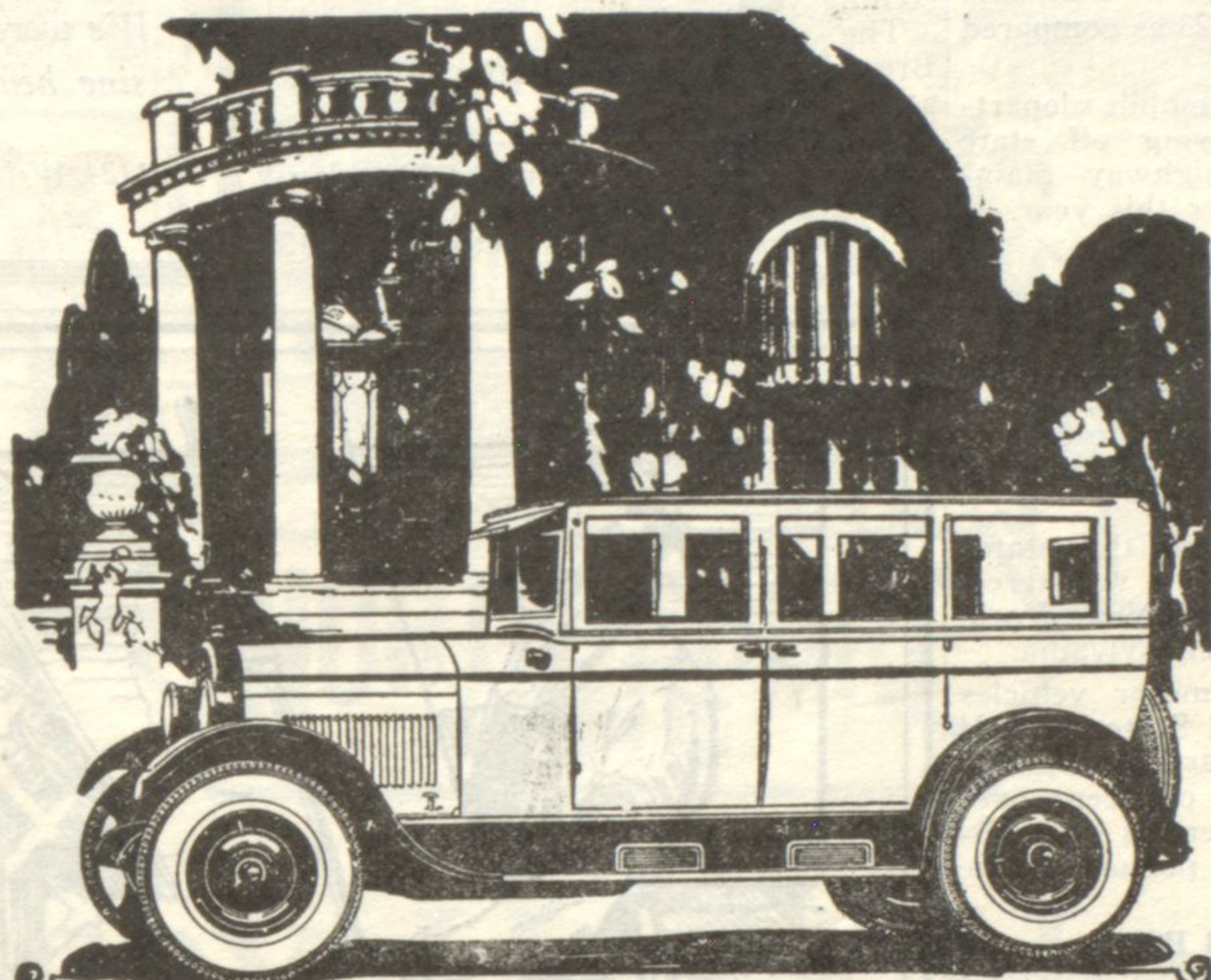
