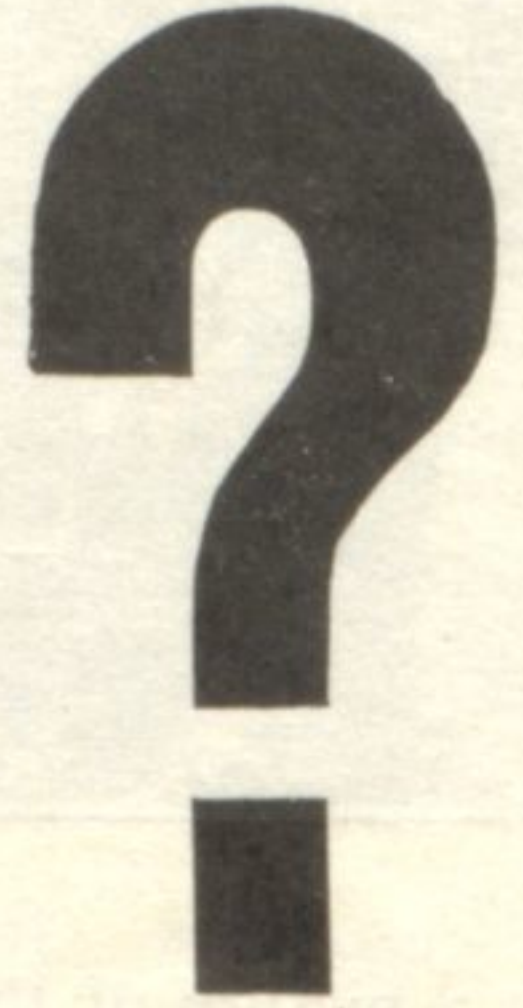
OPERA TALKS TO BEGIN

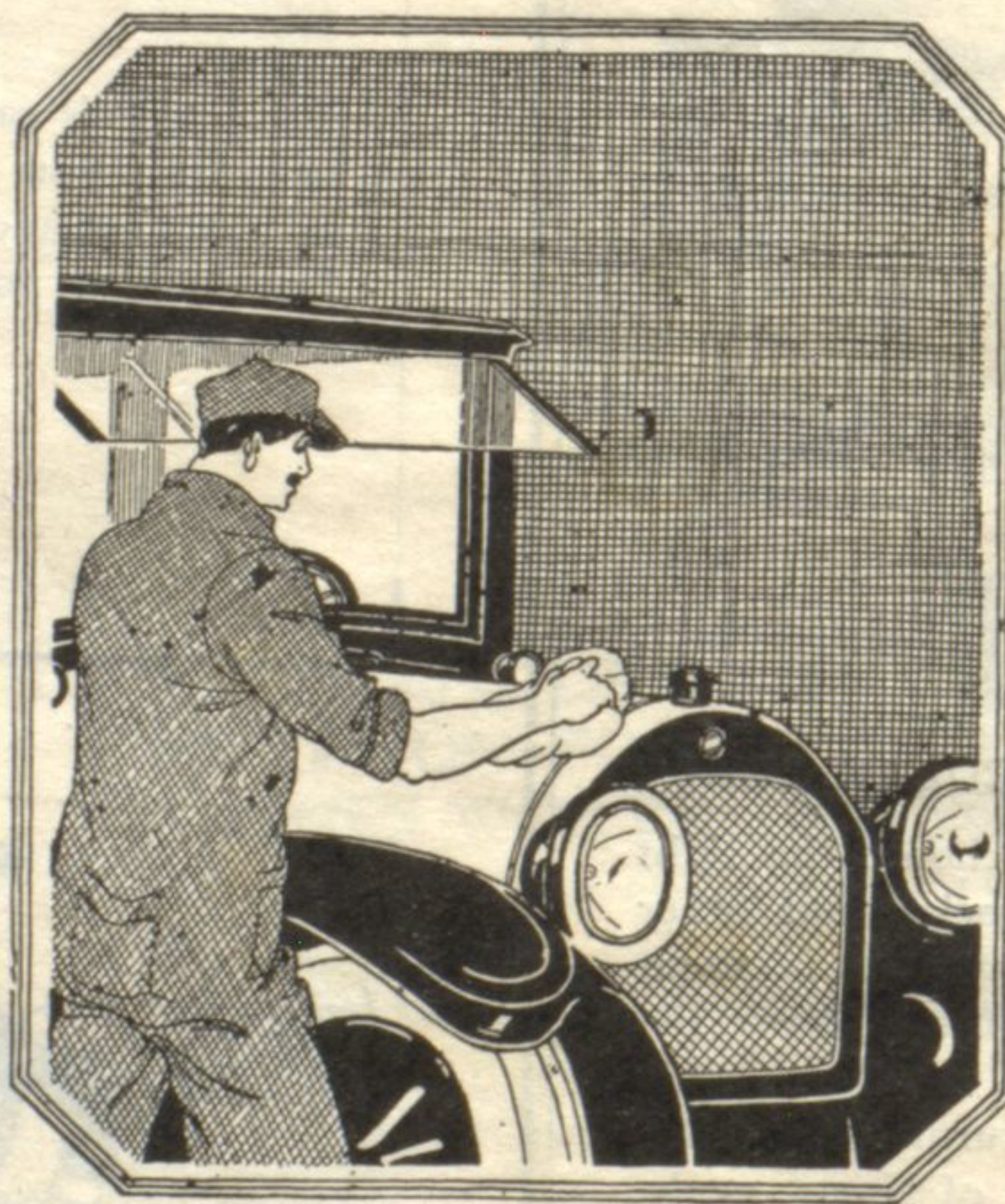
