

## HEAR GREAT WAR HERO

Winnetka League of Women Voters Joins in State Convention at Congress Hotel November 10-12

The Winnetka League of Women Voters announce the fifth annual convention of the Illinois League to be held November 10, 11, and 12, in Chicago. Major General Henry T. Allen, one of the most distinguished generals of the World war, commander of the American forces on the Rhine, and America's representative on the Rhineland High Commission, is to be one of the most notable speakers of the convention. He will give a talk at a banquet at the Congress hotel on Armistice night. General Allen is the holder of many military decorations, the D. S. M., the Croix de Guerre with palm, and the French Legion of Honor, but he is working now for permanent peace, and will present his practical peace time program on this occasion.

Mrs. Walter Benson, president of the Winnetka League, will represent Winnetka at the dinner for local league presidents given by Mrs. A. A. Carpenter on the first day of the convention.

Other events of especial interest follow: On the morning of November 11, Mrs. Medill McCormick and Mrs. Kellogg Fairbanks, the two national committee women from Illinois, will speak on "How to Make Politics Vital to Women." On this occasion, women public officials and official women representatives of leading party groups, will be present to take part in the discussion.

That afternoon, a tea for new women voters, those just of age, will be given by Mrs. John V. Farwell at the Woman's City club. Young women students in the various colleges, universities, and normal schools in Illinois, are invited that they may have an opportunity to become personally acquainted with the organization devoted to the political education of women.
