"I am announcing my candidacy for renomination as Congressman-at-Large for Illinois at the next April primaries.

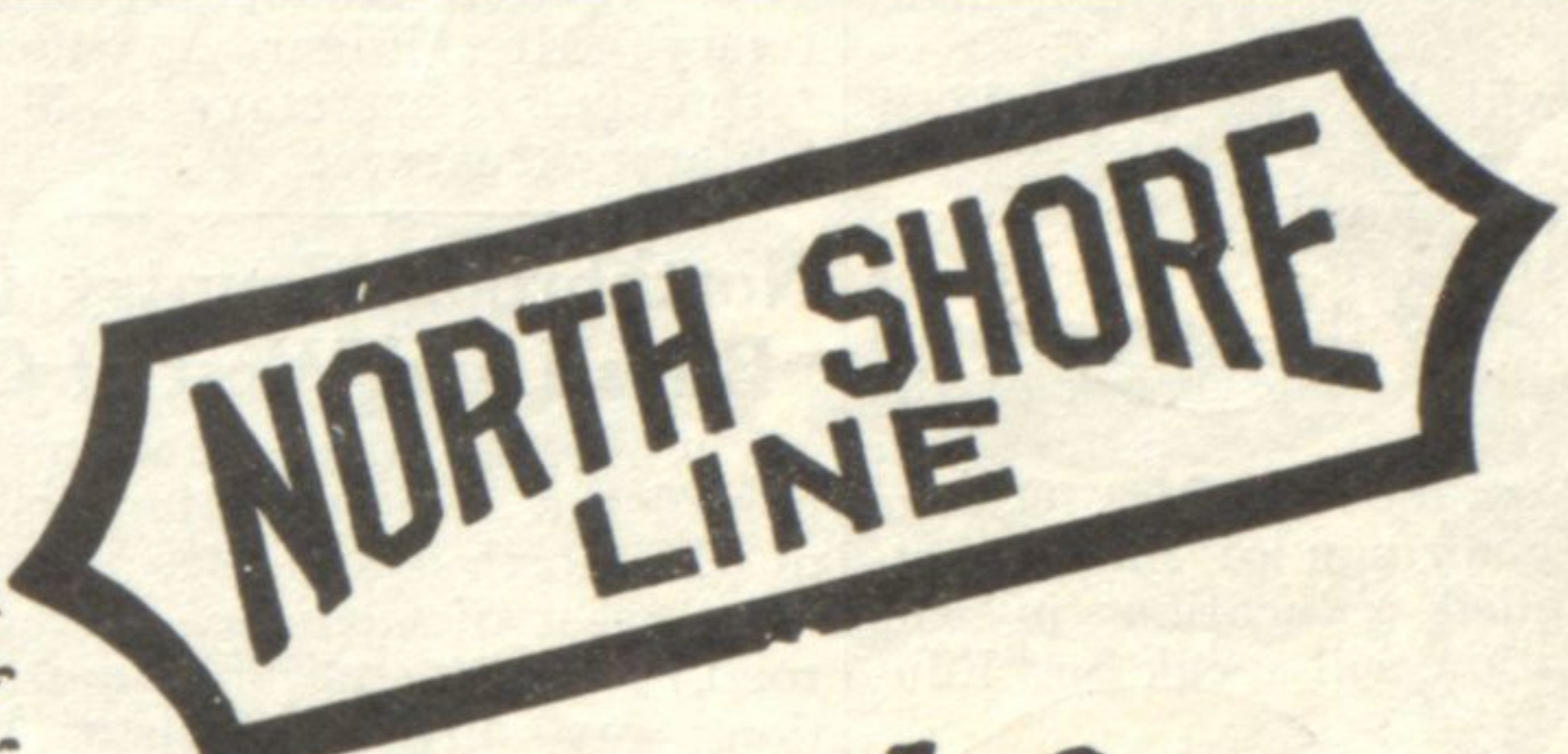
"I hope that my record meets with
