Miss Florence Harrison, fourth regional secretary will speak on the work of local leagues in other states, and the presidents are to discuss "How to Use your Members, How to Get the Program Over, and the Financing of a Local League."

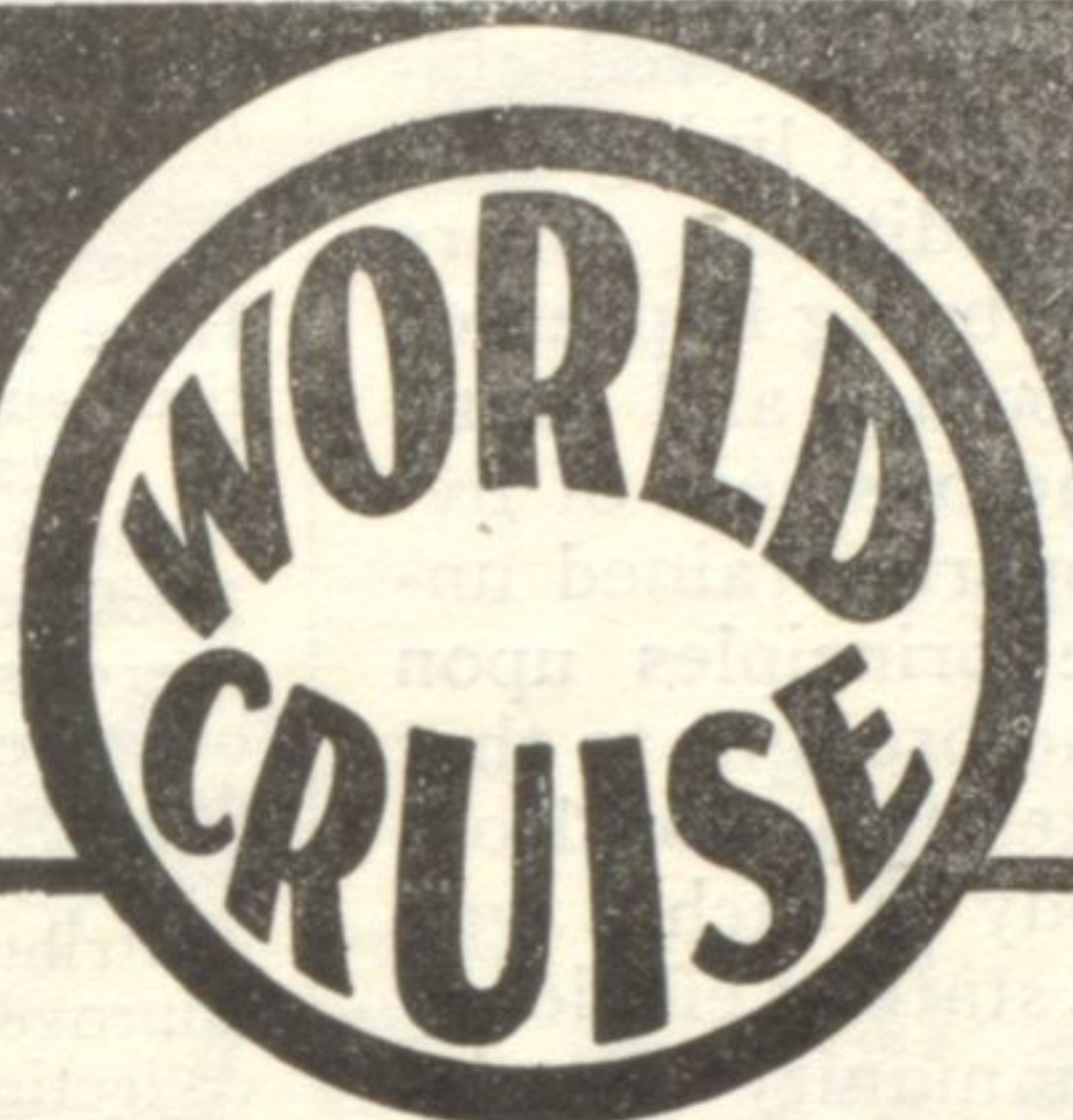
