MARRY IN WINNETKA

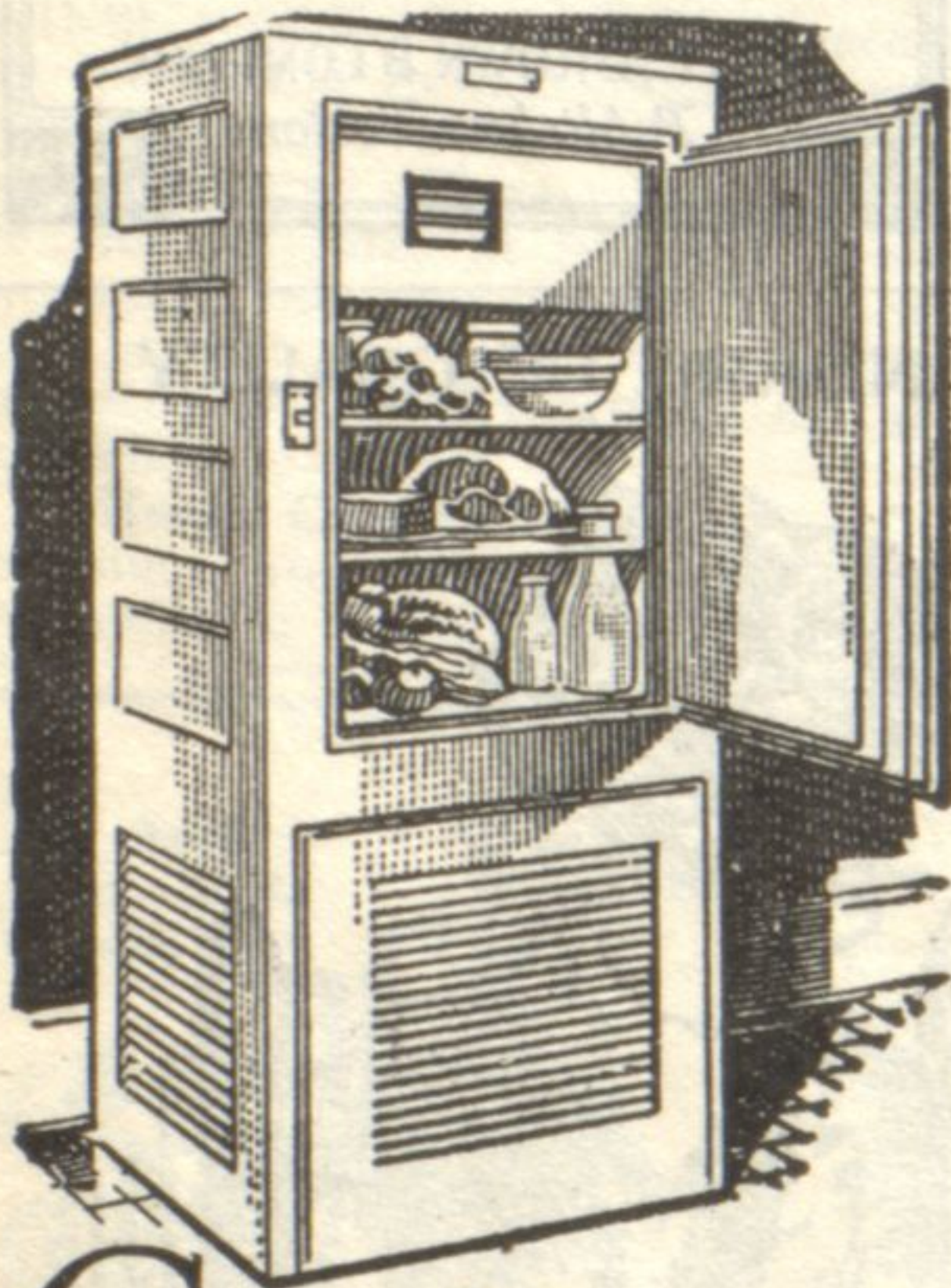

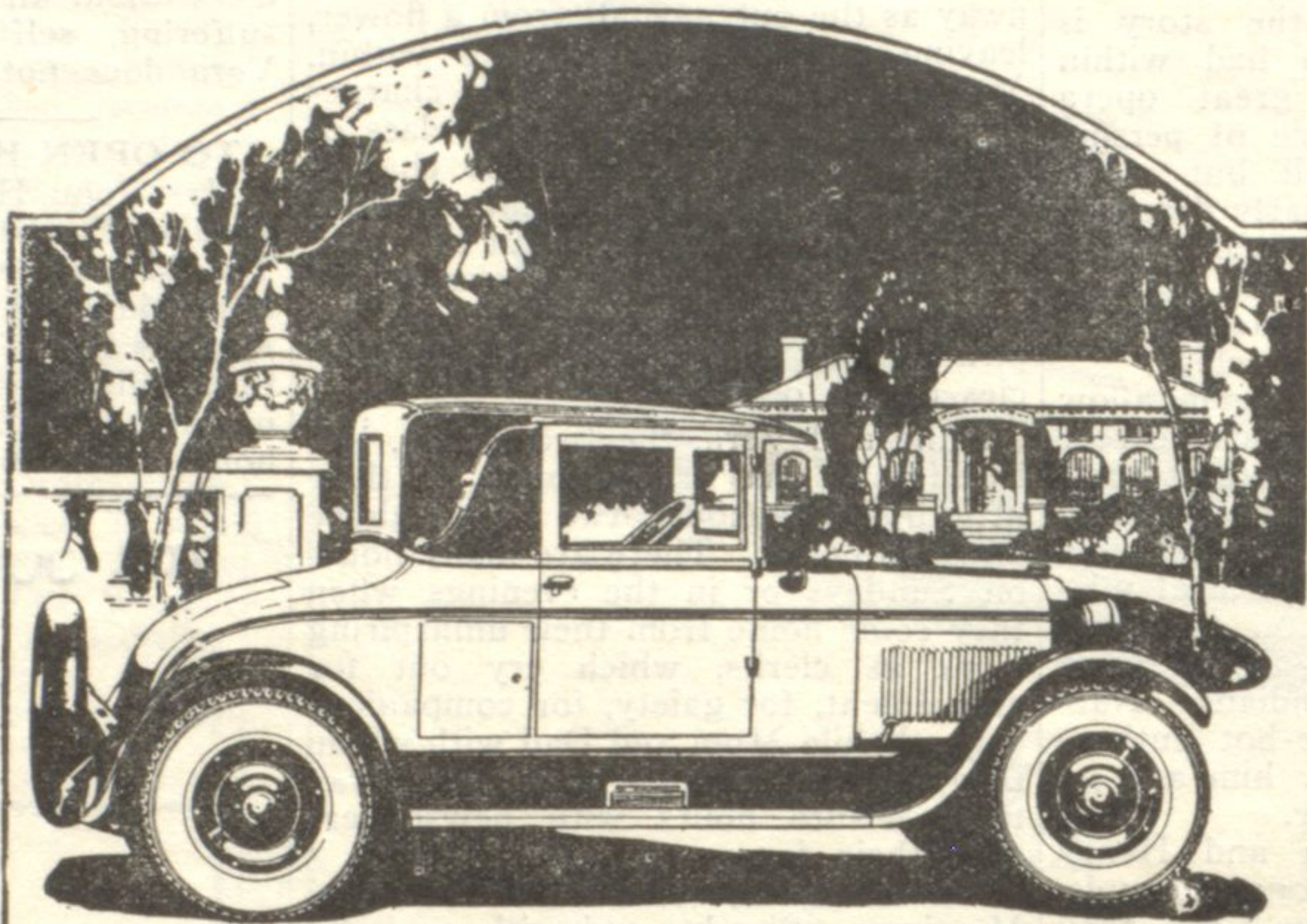
