All families in the community are invited to share in the festival by bringing to the church today gifts of fruit, vegetables, jellies, nuts, canned goods, and whatever is not easily perishable. These will make an unusual decoration for the Sunday service, and on Monday will be taken to the Day Nursery of the Olivet Baptist church on the south side of Chicago.

This is one of the largest churches for colored people in the United States and the Day Nursery cares for young children whose mothers work by the day, many of them helping in Winnetka homes. These children have three meals at the Nursery. The older ones go to school while the little tots play games and have kindergarten work and some rest hours.

The Thanksgiving spirit is beginning to show itself and this Harvest Home Festival is a splendid manifestation of good will toward those who need help.
