Art Patrons Encourage Interest in Local Work

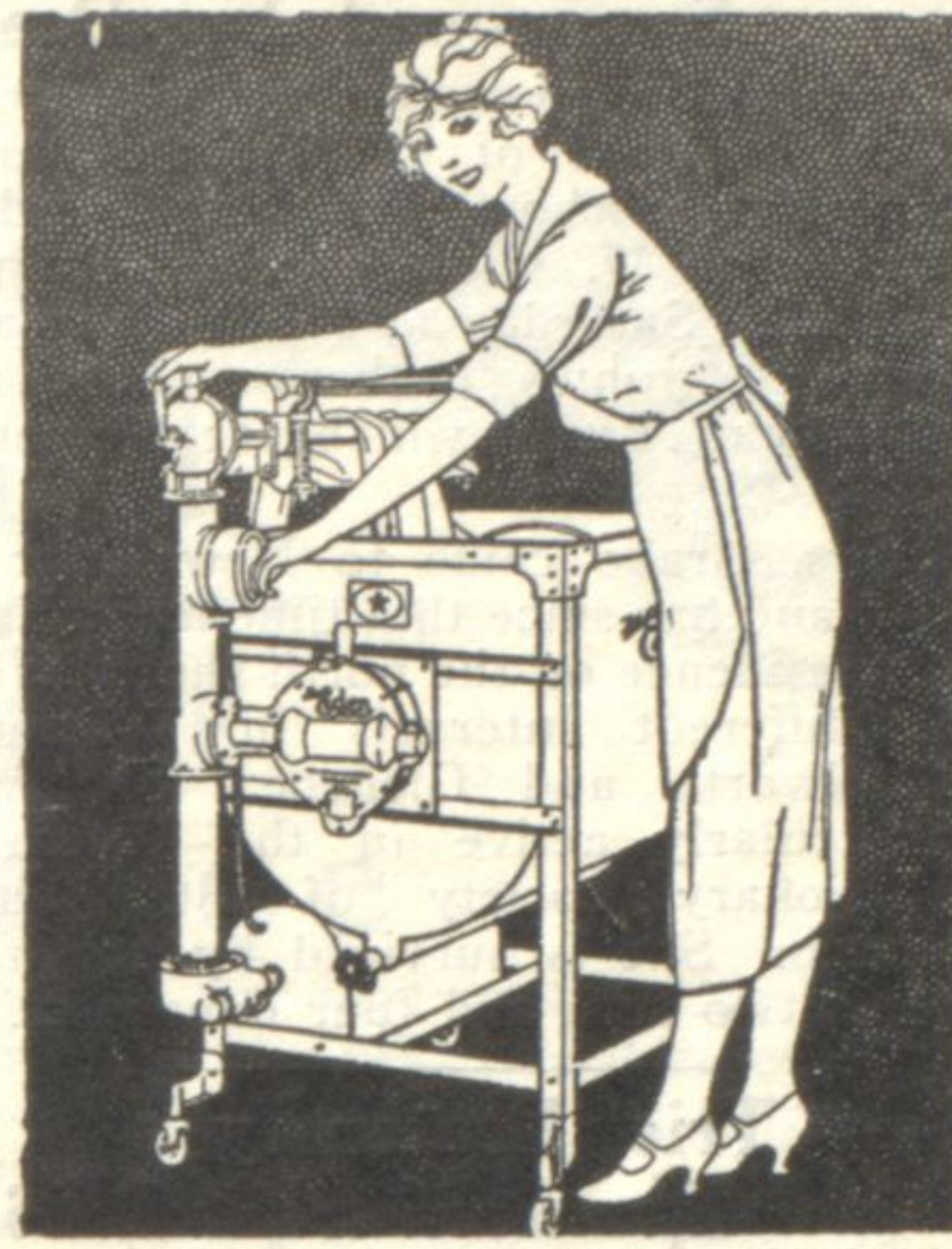
