### Announce Exam to Fill Winnetka Postmastership

To fill the position of postmaster in Winnetka, the United States Civil Service Commission has announced, at the request of the Postmaster-General and in accordance with an order of the President, an open competitive examination. Applications must be filed on or before December 8.

To be eligible for the examination, an applicant must be a citizen of the United States, must reside within the delivery of this post office, must have so resided for at least two years next preceding the examination date, must be in good physical condition, and within the prescribed age limits. Both men and women are admitted.

Under the terms of the Executive order, the Civil Service Commission will certify to the Postmaster-General the names of the highest three qualified eligibles, if as many as three are qualified, and the Postmaster-General will select one for nomination by the President. Confirmation by the Senate is the final action.
